Weed Specialists to Treat Sea Spinach Pest on Seabird Seawall

Weed specialists will treat an infestation of Sea Spinach (*Tetragonia decumbens*) on the Seabird seawall in May, as part of the current rehabilitation process. Planting of native plants by the local community will then follow in July and August.

Sea Spinach is an invasive weed that is prevalent in coastal areas throughout the region and strong growth over past six months on the seawall suggests that if left untreated the Sea Spinach will out-compete native plants. Treatment of the Sea Spinach will help to reduce competition for the existing native plants which were planted by the community in 2016 and assist new native seedlings for planting in 2017.

This will be a one-off treatment however the site may require several treatments over the next 12 to 24 months to allow the local native seedlings to fully establish. Treatment will take place in mid to late May by Shire contractors, as weather permits.

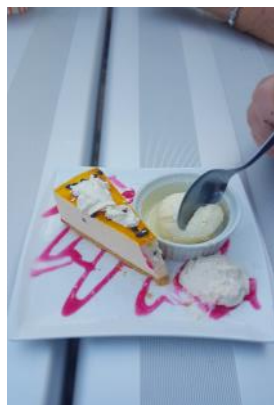
