NBN is Here!

Telstra provided an information van at Guilderton in early June to answer questions and provide information about connecting to the NBN. It is expected that Woodridge, Seabird, Guilderton and Gabbadah will all go live at the end of June 2017. But things don't automatically convert – you need to go into a telecommunications shop (Telstra/Optus etc) to authorise changing to NBN.... **problems can arise if you attempt to do this over the phone** (a point of contact is always a good thing just in case something goes wrong).

- We all have **18 months** to do this – after which we will lose connection (think digital & analog tv).
- There is no need to change your package – unless desired.
- There will be no connection fees applicable for home connections with Telstra. However those with mobile broadband may incur connection fees.
- Split providers (phone & internet) may have connection issues – consult your providers for more information.
- Home security & Medi-alert system owners will need to speak to their provider companies.
- Our local Telstra NBN consultant is Nat who is based at the Ocean Keys Telstra shop.

A bit of history about the area before Woodridge, Neergabby & surrounds.

In the early 1840's the King family came to Australia and gained possession of land along the Gingin Brook from Gingin to Moore River. Settled at the Junction, now known as Neergabby, early 1870's. Hotel was built in the 1870's. A main stack route. In 1864 Richard and his son Daniel King obtained the 6 forty acre blocks along the Moore River known as 'Caraban'.

Stanley King (one of Daniel's sons) inherited those 6 blocks and began building a house from mud bricks made on the property, and brought his bride Clara (nee Jones) there to live in 1906. Shortly after he purchased 500 acres of land from Midland Railway Co (MRC). This property joined Caraban and now joins Woodridge at the west.

Stanley & Clara King raised 10 children (6 girls & 4 boys) at Caraban.

May 1946 David, Percy & Ronald King (Stanley's sons) bought 3,500 acres from MRC; this joined the 500 acres known as Cave Hill.

1954-1956(?) the Lancelin-Wanneroo Rd was put through. This divided the 3,500 acres, 1800 acres east of the road & 1700 to the west of the road.

Ronald King took the 1800 acres east & David & Percy the 1700 acres west of the road backing onto the Caraban Property. In 1968 Ronald sold his 1800 acres to Croots, who later sold to Sun City Market Gardens.

In early 1970's David & Percy sold the 1700 acres joining Caraban to a developer and thus became Woodridge.

The King brothers also had a 90 year lease on the coastal property joining Woodridge on the south. This was a 4,000 acre property, so at that time the Caraban farm included the river blocks, Cave Hill, 3,500 acres from MRC and leased property, giving them a holding of over 7 & a half thousand acres. This was a cattle farm and had around 400 head of breeding cows.

Originally Woodridge included the Golf Links in Woollybush Loop, which was later developed for housing.

This was written a few years ago by Kaye King-Farmer who sadly passed away in May aged 93yrs. Descendant's of the King Family still own and live on property along the Moore River in Caraban.

We have had numerous call-outs during June (5 over a period of only 5 days)—including 2 on one day, to which our crews could not attend both at once so had to call assistance from Guilderton, whose station is actually in Redfield Park, which takes approximately 20 mins to get here plus time to organize crew and oh, the traffic lights on Indian Ocean Drive causing them to take even longer! So when lighting your fires *please* take this and weather conditions into consideration before lighting. If your fire goes out of control please phone 000 so a crew can be dispatched as quick as possible. Thankyou.

NOTES FROM SEABIRD

On Saturday 10th June at least 40 volunteers turned out to help with the second planting event above the seawall at Seabird. Afterwards they adjourned to the Seabird Hall where a sausage sizzle was hosted by the Seabird Progress Association (SPA). Approximately 3,000 plants were sourced for this with SPA, NACC and the Shire of Gingin working collaboratively. At this stage 2,000 have been planted and the remaining 1,000 will be planted by members of the Seabird community over the next 2 weeks. Anyone with a spare hour or two contact Frank on 9577-1640 to arrange picking up plants. SPA wished to thank everyone who helped in this massive effort. In particular it wishes to thank Councillors Collard and Elgin who took time from their hectic schedules to participate. Councillor Collard and his wife Lana were spotted on Sunday returning for another punishing session on the steep bank above the wall. Thank you all, your efforts were much appreciated.

SPA also wishes to advise that:

Its committee held a Special Meeting following the planting event to discuss the outcome of two requests made to the Shire of Gingin to assist with funding a cost estimate and preliminary engineering design for Stage 2 of SPA's Strategic Plan, the construction of a series of groynes and offshore breakwaters to aid sand retention, reduce swell, enhance the protection afforded by the seawall, and extend its life.

These works were recommended by the consulting engineers who advised the Shire during the planning stage of the construction of the seawall, and as well as providing the above benefits, are considered valuable in the protection of the beach in front of the Seabird Caravan Park.

To date, SPA has made presentations to Gingin Shire at two concept forums, one at Lancelin and one at Gingin, with the hope that the Shire would assist with funding to help us have the cost estimate and preliminary engineering design report drawn up. This report will be critical in any approach we make to government to secure funding for construction costs.

SPA has now been advised that request has been unsuccessful. Apparently, the State Government has yet to make a policy decision on whether it is to defend or retreat in relation to the threat of coastal erosion and this has been a factor in the Shire's decision making process.

However, SPA's position is that the seawall was funded by the State Government, and we now have a piece of valuable infrastructure which needs to be protected, enhanced, and developed to provide the best possible outcome for the protection of Seabird's foreshore. SPA believes we should not wait, possibly for years, while Government deliberates on its coastal

erosion policy, because it has a responsibility to the community to continue its work to protect Seabird from erosion.

Accordingly, SPA will initiate Stage 2 of Seabird's Strategic Plan by engaging an engineering firm to provide a cost estimate/preliminary engineering report to enable it to progress our funding applications to government. Funds raised by the Monster Raffle will be put towards the cost of this report. It will keep the Shire informed of its progress, in the hope that ultimately the Shire will be in a position to support its efforts.

Seabird is an entrant in the 2017 Tidy Towns competition organised by Keep Australia Beautiful. Residents have been asked to join in and tidy up their properties prior to the judging. However, tidy streets are not the main focus of our entry. Seabird's entry is in the category of Community Action and Wellbeing and our entry celebrates the way the wider Seabird Community rose to the challenge of erosion to our foreshore, and came together to fight to save the homes threatened with inundation. We will continue to do everything we can to raise the profile of our town, until we have achieved our goal of safeguarding the whole of our beach by implementing Stage 2 of our Strategic Plan, which will see groynes constructed in front of the caravan park and offshore breakwaters which will enhance the protection offered by the seawall, while the breakwaters will provide an additional habitat for fish.

The Re-opening of the Gingin Railway Station on Saturday 3rd June 2017

The occasion was the official opening after all regulation requirements were met by the station from the National Trust and Shire of Gingin. It was also to thank the organisations for the Grants which enabled us to carry out the major renovations and to show our appreciation to the many volunteers that helped during the past five years of the restoration project. The restoration could not have been completed without the financial assistance from the major grants from:-

Lotterywest — Roof restoration and disabled toilet.

Shire of Gingin — Conservation Plan (before work could commence), disabled ramp and staircase, fencing contribution and use of machinery.

Other grant contributions — *Tronox*, *Treasure Trove* and *Image Resources* to enable us to install safety fencing around the perimeter of the station grounds.

The Lions Club of Gingin/Chittering contributed a proportion of monies to each and every grant obtained.

We also expressed thanks to the many local volunteers that helped us In-kind for their services and in particular the Gingin Men's Shed members for all the work carried out over the 5 year period of the restoration.

We were pleased to have the Opening Ceremony officiated by the Hon. Christian Porter MP who unveiled the plaque commemorating the Opening and also presenting Certificates of Appreciation. Attendees the Hon. Martin Aldridge MLC, President of the Shire of Gingin Mr David Roe, Shire CEO Mr Jeremy Edwards and Councillors. Also we were very pleased the CEO of the National Trust, Mr Julian Donaldson was able to attend.

A thank you to Robert Brodie-Hall President of the Gingin Men's Shed who carried out an excellent task of MC at the event.

Important Notice – Fire Burning Vigilance

The Shire is urging residents to be extra vigilant when conducting burn offs on their properties.

Since the end of the restricted burning period at 31st May, the Shire's volunteer fire brigades have been called out to numerous escape burns across the Shire, including coastal areas, which could have been prevented.

Residents are reminded there has not been much rain, and many paddocks and areas of bush land are still dangerously dry.

"It's really important you **do not leave your fire** while you are burning off," said Shire of Gingin CSM Phil Barrett. "Despite it being officially winter, DFES have reported over 500 escape burns across the State since 1st May this year - that's just in eight weeks. This is a worrisome trend."

The spate of recent fires has also put a strain on volunteer fire fighter resources in recent weeks, whose numbers are down owing to annual leave at a time when bushfires are not generally problematic.

"Complacency has consequences - remain with your fire at all times," said Mr Barrett. "If you are in doubt on what you should do please contact us for advice before you burn."

Continuation of Coastal dunes revegetation at community planting day - Guilderton

In 3 hours the planting squad planted nearly 1,500 seedlings and were duly awarded with freshly made salad rolls and cool drinks.
