



GUILDERTON VISITOR CENTRE

Did you know that our lighthouse, which was built in 1983 from special wedge shaped bricks to create the tapered cylindrical form that it appears now, is the only major navigation light between Fremantle and Jurien Bay? Its elevation is 76.75 metres with a range of 41km. The original lens was manufactured in Sweden in 1936 and installed at the Hamelin Island lighthouse. When this was decommissioned it was moved to Guilderton. The lens was replaced in March 2008 and thanks to the Australian Maritime Safety Authority it is on loan and displayed in the bar area of

the Country Club.


