HEADS UP!

Have you seen them on our roads yet? I've seen quite a few – unfortunately some that have already been run over. Winter doesn't seem to want to let go just yet, however our little garden helpers' instincts have seen them wandering out from their hide-e-holes to seek warmth and in search for their mate life-long mate. They are making their way onto our roads and we need to keep our eyes peeled for them as we drive around our communities.

Did you know that these little creatures can live up to 50 years of age and are monogamous; it has been discovered they search for the same partner for 30 years and beyond. This ability of recognition and memory demonstrates a high intellect as far as reptiles go. Read recently of a study performed by a Professor Michael Bull in South Australia who found that they also demonstrate grief – he observed the female of a pair that had got herself trapped in a wire fence. Her partner stayed with her for two days after she died, trying to urge her forward, before finally leaving her.

The Bobtail (or 'Blue-Tongue Lizard' / 'Shingleback' / 'Pinecone Lizard' / 'Sleepy Lizard' to name a few of the common names associated with the *Tiliqua rugosa*) can be a very helpful friend to have around the garden as they eat snails, caterpillars and other insects, and can be very helpful in keeping down the population of these invertebrate garden pests. To encourage Bobtails onto your property, plant dense undercover vegetation involving a mix of local, native shrubs, and plants like grasstrees and sword sedges. Retain dead vegetation and logs that Bobtails use to shelter in. Create shelters for Bobtails with corrugated iron or logs. Do not destroy rabbit warrens as these can act as shelters for them. Also train your pet dogs and cats to leave them be.

But most importantly, please keep an eye out for them while driving on our roads...

Seabird Progress & Sports Association Inc.

Just letting you all know that NEO Infrastructure has won a prestigious award for excellence in civil infrastructure. They entered the Seabird Foreshore Stabilisation Works project in the WA Earth Awards, in Category 2, projects costing between \$1 million and \$5 million, and took out the award against stiff competition. There were 5 entries, the most of all categories, including the Koombana Drive reconstruction in Bunbury, Guildford Railway Station, Busselton Foreshore upgrade, and Sunset Heritage Precinct upgrade. The award recognises the excellence of the project and construction, as well as the value of stakeholder engagement and the positive results. The Seabird project now becomes an entry in the National Awards, in Canberra, in November 2017, and we hope Neo goes on and cleans up there as well. Congratulations to everyone involved, particularly Mike McGurk and his team at NEO, and thanks to their success Seabird remains in the public eye. This can only be a positive as we try to save the foreshore.

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“Living Wake” Or “Celebration of Life”

Call it what you like, but such an event was held in the Guilderton Country Club on Friday 15th September for Allan Giblett, a long-time resident of Guilderton. Allan purchased a building block in March 1963 and built a holiday home for his family. In those days the only persons who lived in Guilderton were the Caravan Park Manager and his family. Limestone roads, no power or water but a beautiful place to be. He got involved with the Progress (now Community) Association and was their Secretary in 1968 when house-holders in town were canvassed to ascertain their interest in establishing a Country Club. The response was unanimous and a Club was formed. Debentures were sold to raise finance and with the help of the Gingin Shire clubrooms were built and the Club opened in February 1971 by Mr Norman Fewster, the Shire President or Chairman. Allan was on the original management committee and I think is the only remaining member; the others being deceased. He served as President, Vice President and committee person over the years and was eventually made a Life Member in appreciation of his service. He has also been made a Life Member of the Bowling Club and was on the foundation committee of the Golf Club.

In his involvement in the community he has been President of the Association and was involved in the Lower Moore River working group, the Visitor Centre and Library and more recently the Mens' Shed. He will be 90 years old in the New Year and is looking forward to celebrating his birthday with friends despite failing health.

Patrossi Fresh Pty Ltd is a new identity in Western Australia but in Victoria Patrossi Farms were renowned for their large potato farms in excess of up to 3000 acres, growing for Woolworths for many years and also supplying independent businesses. Then in 2008 my brother and I went into a retail and wholesale fruit and vegetable business. A few years later I decided to make a change and do something different which landed me in WA; identifying that there are areas that lacked fresh produce or access to fresh produce. Talking to my cousins in the southern part of WA, they convinced me to jump back into the industry.

Patrossi Fresh was born. Together with my partner Giovanna we have worked hard to break into the industry; starting out supplying fresh produce to people's door from Wanneroo to Lancelin, taking notice of a big shortage of fresh produce from Yanchep to Lancelin. Lower Coastal Neighbourhood Watch Meeting August 2017

This meeting was attended by the Main Roads Mid-West – Gascoyne Region based in Geraldton who are now responsible for IOD. The project manager is Bernie Miller.

When they showed maps of the area they are responsible for unfortunately IOD is a minute part, tacked onto the very bottom of their large area of responsibility. They have only recently been allocated this section.

ISSUES DIRECTLY RELEVANT TO WOODRIDGE**Funded for this year:**

The widening and resurfacing with a concrete overlay of the Moore River Bridge would be completed at the end of September. There is an extra ½ metre each side, total of 1 metre wider.

It was noted that the upgrade to the toilet block at the Moore River rest area was complete.

IOD – speed zones currently under review.

IOD centre lines marking has been reviewed.

Roadside vegetation is also being reviewed particularly at intersections, and midblock curves in relevance to line of sight. Also noted a review of road side advertising signs and if they obstruct line of sight particularly approaching townships and intersections.

Other future Projects on IOD – it was noted that with the current and new budget restrictions it was unlikely to occur in 2017-2018 financial year.

Noise reduction – there are plans to Micro surface that part of IOD near Woodridge for noise reduction. No date on when this would probably occur but “within 12 months” if more funding became available.

A proposed Roadhouse at the corner of Gingin Brook Road and IOD. No specific details on which side or where entrance / exits would be.

Four new overtaking lanes – 2 north and 2 southbound between Seabird and Lancelin.

Intersection upgrades at Military Road, Guilderton Road and Lancelin Road.

Ongoing installation of “audible edge line” or rumble strips between Yanchep and Ledge Point.

Road maintenance – if residents notice sections that require work e.g. new pot holes or surface break ups, particularly after rain, are encouraged to contact Main Roads on 138 138 to report.

It was stated that a new contract has been signed for road maintenance with a new company. This had different terms & conditions and road maintenance would be carried out differently to the previous decade.

Brand Highway

Lots of work being done there as it is a main truck haulage route, I haven't written it down but have copies of the slides if anyone is interested.

The next meeting of the Lower Coastal Neighbourhood Watch Meeting will be at **Guilderton on Dec 13th 2017** residents encouraged to attend

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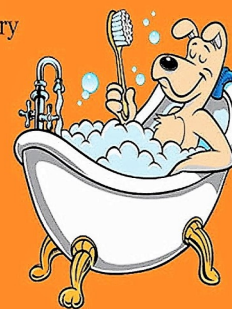


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"I GOT SO MUCH OUT OF THIS WEEKEND"

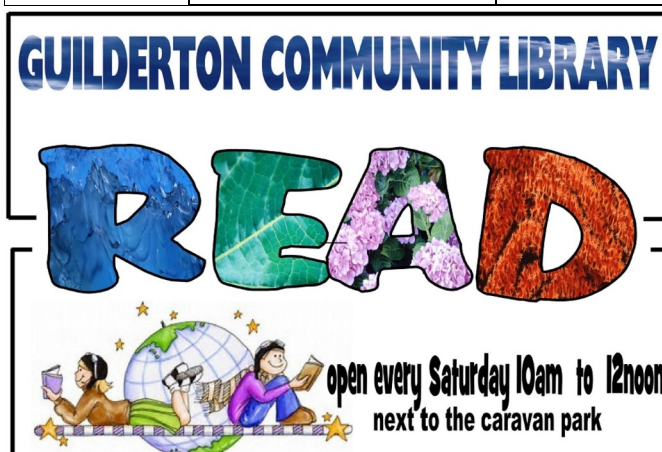
