The NBN is now available to most houses in Woodridge. I recently applied to be connected. We have all been inundated with offers from various companies. It will be up to you to choose which one you pay.

The company I chose offered limited or limitless data, varying speeds between 12mega bytes per second and 100 mbps. Again your choice.

However, the reason for writing to the MRNews is that they also offered a VOIP phone which operates through the NBN wire. Not the old copper wire. This means you no longer have to pay the \$35 rental fee a month. Calls to local, standard and national are free. You pay extra for international and mobiles. However, be aware that it also means that if the electricity or NBN fails you cannot use the home phone.

We chose that method because we have mobile phones in an emergency.

Have a look online at all the varying offers to find one that suits your life and pocket. It could save you \$35 a month!

Hi everybody,

As explained at the recent Woodridge Community Assoc Public Meeting, there is now a community car available for all residents in the Lower Coastal Area of the Gingin Shire to utilise for medical appointments. Details about this car are as follows

- ♦ This is a joint project between the Lions, the Shire, Lancelin Community Resource Centre and Bendigo Bank.
- ♦ It is a service for elderly and unwell community members to enable them to attend medical appointments- it is not a shopping service.
- ♦ Bookings will be made through the Lancelin CRC (phone 9655 2033)
- ♦ All drivers are volunteers and are required to have a valid drivers licence and a current CPR 1st Aid certificate. The 1st Aid training is sponsored by the Bendigo Bank.
- ♦ When a person gets notification of an appointment they will ring the CRC and book a car for the required date and time.
- ♦ The driver will pick the person up at their home, take them to their appointment, wait for them and then drop them back at their home.
- ♦ The passenger will be required to pay for the petrol used (approx \$20), plus any parking fees.

We had the Official Launch of the car on Thursday (19th) at the CRC Lancelin.

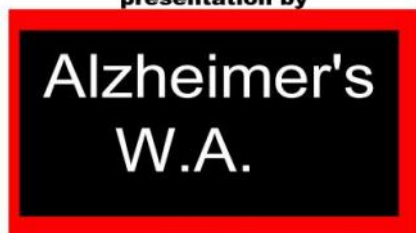

AMBO NEWS

A warm welcome to Kate Nicholson who is with us again. Great to have you back. Also we are very pleased to have Sophie Gofton join our ranks as a volunteer ambulance officer. Congratulations! May it be a wonderful and rewarding journey for you. Again another busy month for us with 18 calls. Thanks to all the officers who helped cover during this time.

Spring is here and it is time to be aware of snakes. Best to have a couple of crepe bandages on hand in the first aid kit or car incase of a bite. Remember to keep the bitten limb as still as possible to help prevent the venom spreading. Most years we transport a couple of snake bite casualties.

Also bees are about. Occasionally people who did not react seriously with a sting can develop an anaphylactic reaction over time. Symptoms are varied but trouble breathing and symptoms of shock (i.e. low blood pressure) require an epi-pen. Please note that three out of ten people suffering from anaphylaxis may require more than one epi-pen, which is why it is important the ambulance is called.

For those wanting to learn more about first aid we have a Provide First Aid course (new name for Senior first aid) at the Redfield Community Hall (white transportable) at 106 Paperbark Ave. It will be run 10am to 2pm on 8th and 9th November (Wed/Thur). Please note we advertised this as an evening class in the previous Moore River News. Cost is SJA standard price of \$160 which goes to our local ambulance sub branch. All enquires please contact Abbie at SJA Northam on 96211613. For those requiring an evening course Lancelin will be running a course those evenings from 4 to 8pm.

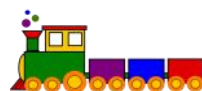

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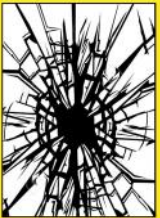
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GUILDERTON GOLF CLUB

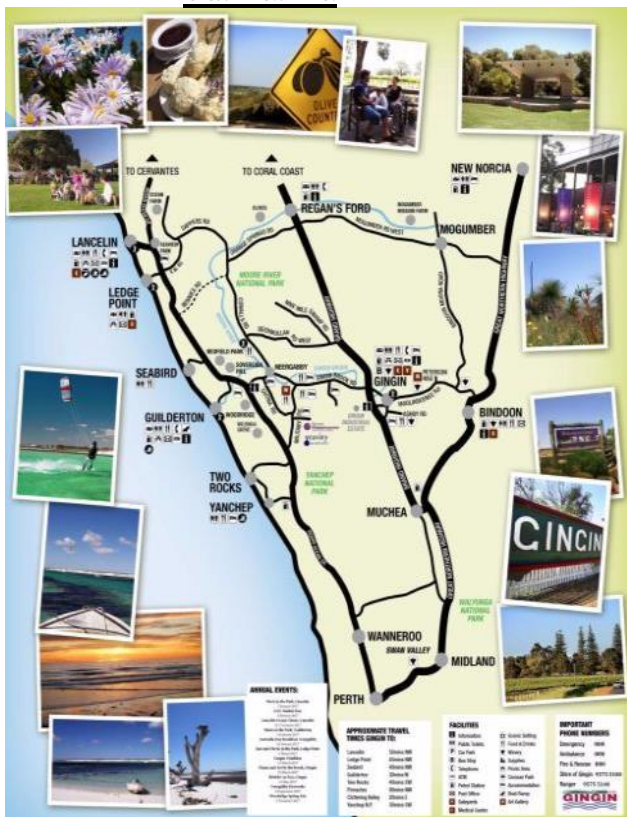

Welcome to the Shire of Gingin. are being chauffeured around the sights of the Moore River Region.

We begin on Indian Ocean Drive at Yanchep National Park, then head north up the coast and return via an inland route. As we travel north from Perth, there are many interesting areas to explore, through the Gateway to the Wildflower Region, you will find 55 different varieties of Banksia throughout the Shire. Passing through the horticultural areas, you can view many hectares of vegetables being grown for the local and export markets. The Shire of Gingin is fast becoming a major food bowl region.

Continuing on Route 66, we turn left 88km north of Perth and enter the picturesque town of **GUILDERTON**. Excellent fishing opportunities exist in the river and ocean waters. The river provides a swimming area for children with a newly completed fixed deck area and floating jetty/pontoon. A ten minute drive further north brings us to the delightful small town of **SEABIRD**. Services available include a children's playground, a shop and a tavern. A newly completed seawall protects existing homes and infrastructure from coastal erosion.

Continue to drive for a further 20 minutes north, through rolling coastal plains you will reach **LEDGE POINT**. Primarily a crayfishing town, Ledge Point is fast becoming a centre that caters for activities for all age groups and is well worth a visit. Fishing and safe swimming beaches are a feature which compliment the caravan park and other holiday accommodation, making it an ideal family holiday spot. There is a store and country club, along with a bowling green, nine-hole golf course, tennis courts, skate park and barbecue facilities.
