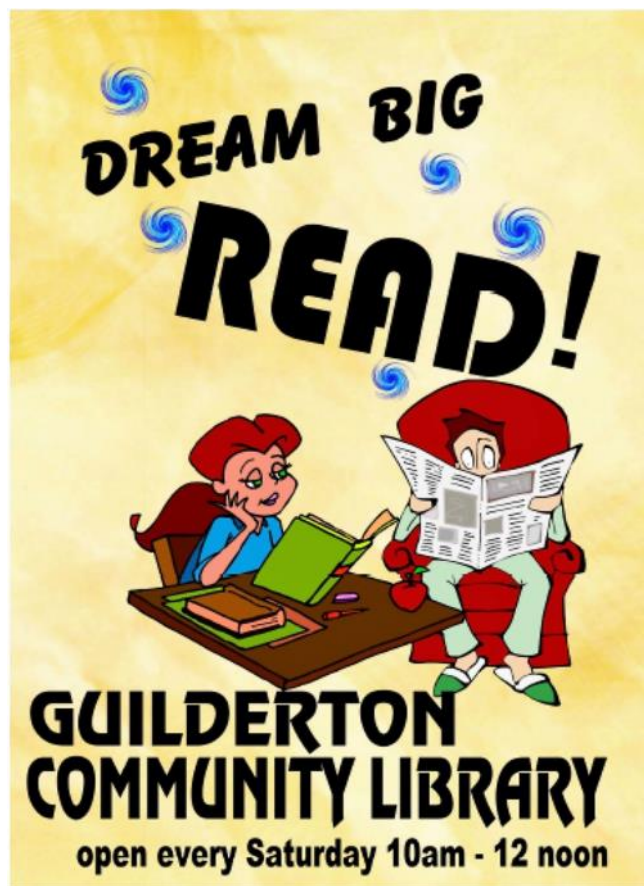

Work on the renovation of the area around the pond is expected to commence very shortly....keep an eye out for its transformation.

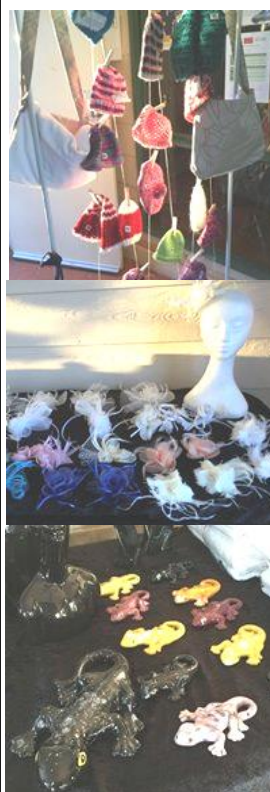

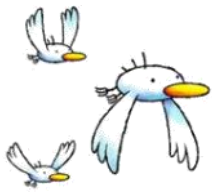

NOTES FROM SEABIRD

The Cardno report

Gingin Shire Council has commissioned a draft coastal hazard risk management and adaption plan. The plan examines “a range of options for addressing the challenges of coastal erosion” (Cardno 2017 p.iii). Community consultation is identified as an essential part of the process in developing plans to manage risk and as critical to its success (Cardno 2017 p.19) but many Seabird property owners will feel left out of this process, because apart from one workshop last year in Lancelin and an online survey, the consultation is occurring after the recommendation to retreat has been tabled.

Seabird would have preferred a community consultation here in Seabird, so that we could have shown the consultants, whose logo announces “Cardno Shaping the Future,” how we want to, “shape” our own future rather than be told how we should, “shape” it or worse still, have it “shaped” for us by people who are not part of our community. We hold that community engagement means developing ideas alongside the community, not developing a plan and then trying to convince stakeholders of its value at a “workshop,” in a town 40 kilometres away. If a workshop involving the Seabird community were to have been held it should have been held in Seabird before the draft report was produced.

Whilst there is a plan to hold a community workshop in Lancelin on April 28th the reality is that 70% of property owners in Seabird do not live here full time. No genuine effort has been made to establish when might be a suitable time for them to have input into this process or where might be the most convenient place for this to occur. April 28th is in the school holidays and many people may be away or caring for grandchildren. As many property owners in Seabird reside in Perth the most suitable venue is unlikely to be Lancelin which is 40 kilometres north of Seabird. In any case the draft plan already appears to recommend retreat.

The Seabird community feels disappointed that the report does not consider the option to enhance the protectiveness of the seawall by constructing groynes at intervals in front of the wall, extending along the front of the caravan park. This was recommended by the consulting engineers MP Rogers and Associates, who were hired by the Shire of Gingin to provide advice on an engineering solution to the erosion problem at Seabird.

The Cardno report contains a number of inaccuracies and/or incomplete information. For example:

- Loss of the protective primary foreshore dunes at Seabird was not initiated by rising sea levels, but rather a combination of factors including changes in ocean

currents (caused by infrastructure built south of Seabird and/or cyclical seasonal weather influences), bulldozing dune structures to make access to the beach, and wind erosion of dunes as insufficient attention was paid to the importance of vegetating dunes (this has been the focus of community initiated revegetation over the past two years).

- The report provides for no alternative strategies, there has been no community involvement, it adopts a “one size fits all” approach, regardless of erosion being a localised issue, and there has been no cost benefit analysis provided.

- The adoption of such a plan would see the development of coastal communities stagnate or shrink with a lack of tourism and residential appeal. This is likely to have a flow on effect to the Shire of Gingin causing it to become an economic minnow.

- Although the beach in front of the town may have been limited by the seawall, the erosion had made the beach almost unusable for several years prior to the wall’s construction. At different times of the year there are several metres of beach in front of the wall, which are used by walkers, beachgoers and fisherman.

Seabird was gazetted as a town in 1968 and lots were progressively released and sold by the State Government. The Gingin Shire has collected rates annually from these properties and the State Government has collected annual land tax from non primary residential lots ever since their purchase. This report now supports the retreat option whilst not addressing liability. This positioning shows a lack of leadership, a lack of vision and a lack of basic humanitarian compassion.

Seabird sees these decision makers as culpable and will hold them to account. The Seabird community fought for, and achieved protection from erosion, in the form of a seawall. It has since raised funds, developed plans and estimates to build a series of groynes to enhance its function, and protect the northern beach area and extend its life. Seabird has shown in the past that it is a community that works together to achieve its aims and ensure its survival. We do not accept retreat as an option for our community. Nothing has changed for us, we will continue to work together and will never give up until we find a solution and achieve our objective.

Seabird believes the Shire should be showing leadership in its stewardship of its natural coastal assets and be making them attractive to safe sustainable development. Tourism WA sells our state on the value of its natural beauty and resources including our pristine beaches. The Seabird community values its beaches and coastline and accepts that changes in these assets over time are a natural process. However, it does not accept retreat as an option and wants its position acknowledged. Our community has this message for those who lack the vision and creativity to conceptualise the vibrant future we see for our community, “Seabird, Retreat? Never!”

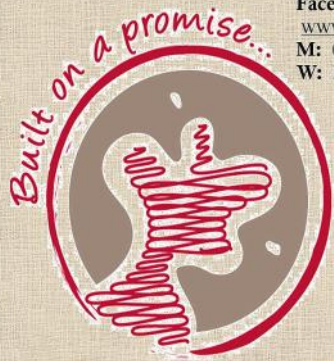

Please contact us, we are more than happy to help and care parcels can be collected.

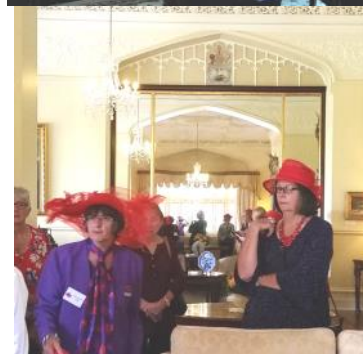
