At the Annual General Meeting held by the Brigade on the 2nd May there was a changing of the guard with a new look leadership team voted in for the coming year, with James Morton given the responsibility to lead this small dedicated team.

YOU TOO COULD JOIN THIS TEAM

As the brigade is made up of a diverse group of volunteers from different age groups, with varying jobs, families and normal lives to lead it can sometimes be difficult to crew the 3 appliances that are assigned to the Brigade.

CAN YOU HELP?

We can always do with more help. There is a basic level of training that is required which is done locally by our local trainers. You need to pass a basic police clearance and have at the minimum a "C" class drivers licence and be prepared to go on a 24/7 call list.

You can assist the Brigade in other ways by becoming an Auxiliary member and be rostered to care for the station and the appliances, assist with logistics and other requirements during localised incidents. You can even help by engaging the brigade to do some of your fire risk mitigation works so they can raise funds for the brigade, members to maintain their skills and for new recruits to learn their own skills.

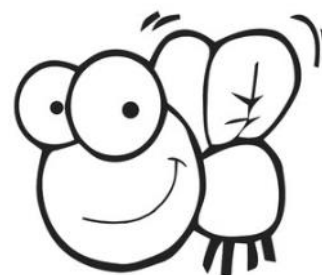

Most of us living in the Lower Coastal region of the Shire of Gingin will remember how bad the stable fly infestation has been in past years. Some of us of course are still suffering the nasty bite. The reason the majority of us are now free of the horror is due to SFAG, which is our local group who have worked tirelessly to bring this issue to our governing bodies and our local growers. The problem is world wide and much scientific research has been done.

Log on to www.stableflyactiongroup.org.au to see all the past editions of the SFAG Newsletter, and the current one, along with Dr Dave Cook's scientific research into stable flies and their effects on the community and livestock.

In their recent newsletter they reported that “*Burial and compaction of post harvest vegetable crop residues is the optimal solution for controlling stable fly development from this source.*”

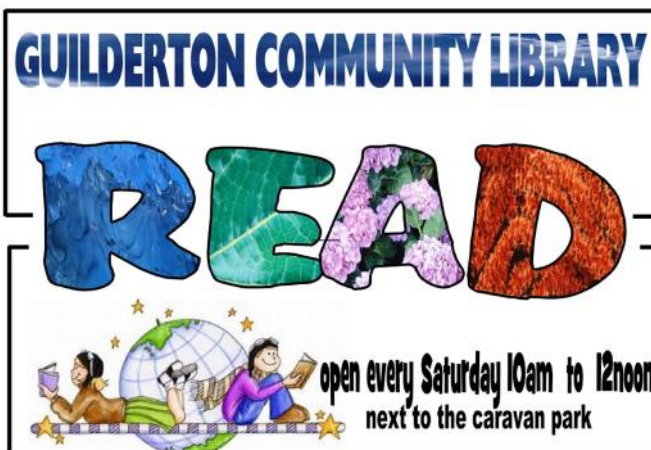

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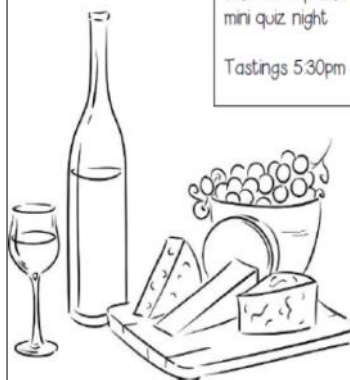
