The Woodridge Community Association held its first Public meeting for 2021 with 38 people joining us for breakfast. Those in attendance again raised concerns over Indian Ocean Drive traffic noise and the first kilometre of King Drive as priorities. WCA have already been in touch with Local and State Government Departments with noise monitors promised in the next couple of weeks.

At the Public Meeting it was agreed to support the Shire of Gingin Australia Day function in Neergabby.

School starts very soon so please when entering or exiting Woodridge please drive with caution through this section of King Drive.

At the AGM, Nov 2020, a subcommittee was assembled to develop a 5-to-10-year plan to improve the Woodridge Community Grounds. The plan is coming together nicely, with three Executive Members meeting with Les Crichton and Allister Butcher from the Shire of Gingin to talk over some of the concepts in the plan and to discuss and establish a good starting point. Thanks, Les and Allister for your help, suggestions, and encouragement.

The first WCA fundraising event for 2021 commence with a Community Market on **Sunday 28th February 2021**.

The Lower Coastal Community Alliance had a very good meeting in Guilderton in late January. Shane Love our local state member of parliament came along to listen to our local issues. There were representatives from Redfield Park, Sovereign Hill, Guilderton, and Woodridge.

The main issues were the excess noise on Indian Ocean Drive, which of course Shane has been active in helping us with. Jenny Walker has been working hard on this issue for us and soon we expect noise monitors to be placed with residents who are affected.

The proposed community bus was also discussed, a motion was passed to officially request that The Shire of Gingin would be asked to support us in housing and running a 12 seater bus in the Lower Coastal region. The Lotteries West grant will be available in May.

The list of past and proposed events for our area was amazing. The Alliance finds this service fantastic so that we don't clash dates.

Helen Sutherland from the Shire was there to help us answer questions and tell us about grants and events the Shire are holding. One of them being in Youth Week and the other in Volunteer Week. More details coming soon. Keep an eye on the Gingin Shire Facebook page.

A CHOICE FOR AGED AND 'NDIS' CARE IN GINGIN NOW AVAILABLE

Gingin people NOW have a choice of Care Providers. Gingin is not limited to one Provider who has all the Care Packages.

In Gingin, previously there has been no alternative Provider offering a FULL service.

WHAT HAS CHANGED?

Under the OLD packages (pre-NDIS), a person was assessed and the package went to a Provider who then managed all the Care.

Under the NEW packages (post NDIS), the package goes to the person who has been assessed and they can then choose the service who does the Providing.

You can even get some care from one Provider and some from another, if you wish as there NOW is a choice in Providers.

It is possible to exchange an OLD package for a NEW one. All you have to do is contact a new Provider and if they can provide, you sign up with them and cancel the old package.

The Gingin Care Group have found an excellent **new Provider - ECHO Community Services** which is willing to set up a full local team, with local people caring for local people, with minimal travel and maximum care.

They also cover NDIS care for all ages over 7 years to 65 years old.

Echo Community Care is based in Bassendean. They are a well-established and valued care team in that area. They are willing to begin their service gradually using their current team, and as more team members are needed, they will employ local people until they have a full local Gingin team.

The **Echo Community Care** model is to keep teams small and in touch, focusing on Care, with familiar, known carers for each person, close contact if there is any problem or issue concerning the client, with minimal administration costs. The **Echo Community Care C.E.O.** is easily accessible to all participants and actively addresses any concerns. Decisions are not made remotely or interstate where there is no local knowledge.

WANT TO APPLY FOR ASSESSMENT?

If people, want to apply for assessment YOU need to fill in an application on line at

My Aged Care. (Some doctors will do that for you, or if you need help ask the Gingin CRC ladies.)

The Application will go to the Assessors in Northam who will ring you and make a time to visit.

There could be a delay of up to a year from assessment to receiving your package, so don't leave it until you are REALLY needing care.

Get in on the Number 1 level if you can, then you can go up as your needs change.

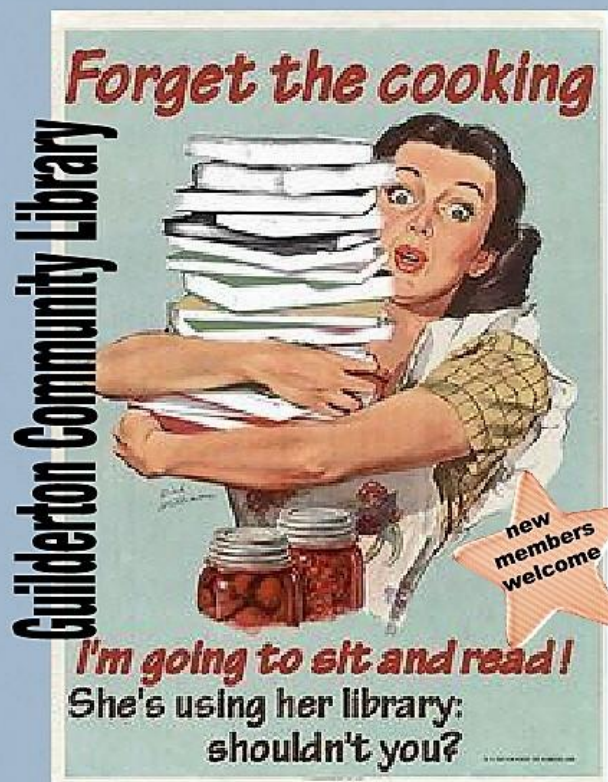

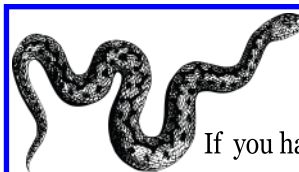

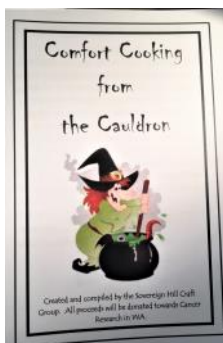

Red Gully & Yeal Bush Fires



Welcome to 2021! Whilst we'd like to say we're off to a great start, the first week of the New Year has probably left a number of us feeling a bit like "I'd like to cancel my subscription to 2021! I've experienced the free 7-day trial and I'm not interested."

All kidding aside, the Shire of Gingin Council and staff would like to express our heartfelt thanks and gratitude to the fire fighters, support staff and the many others who have worked so hard to protect the lives and properties of residents in the Shires of Gingin and Dandaragan this past week. Your efforts are appreciated and recognised as being well and above the call of duty.

It was humbling to witness the professionalism and willingness of all of the various agencies that worked collaboratively and shared resources to overcome first the Red Gully Fire and then the Yeal Fire. This included the Department of Fire & Emergency Services, the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation & Attractions, the Department of Communities, WA Police, Main Roads WA, Western Power, St Johns Ambulance, The Salvation Army, local bush fire brigades and local fire & rescue brigades, brigades from other local governments and many others.

Their commitment to protect our communities will not quickly be forgotten. Bush fires of this magnitude require significant coordination and those that saw the Incident Command Centre in Gingin would understand the level of stakeholder involvement. To all of the Incident Controllers and their professional teams – well done and thank you.

For our part, the Shire of Gingin's staff and Councillors assisted with relaying communications from emergency services to the community, advised on local resources and provided earth moving equipment driven by Shire staff to support the fire-fighting effort.

Staff also provided administrative support, worked at the Evacuation Centre in Guilderton, ran messages/errands and assisted with patrols or donned a firefighting uniform themselves if they were a member with any of the local brigades.

Overall the community was very supportive of emergency personnel as they strove to protect our communities. Of course there were frustrations but fighting a bush fire is a very complicated and dangerous process and emergency personnel will always seek to place the safety of the public above all else. We acknowledge the inconvenience caused and thank you for your support and cooperation during these trying times.

Whilst this threat is mostly passed, the bush fire season is far from over. Please stay safe and if you don't yet have a bush fire plan for your property, then we suggest you find some time to sit down with your family for a "Fire Chat". New Outdoor Activity Space Works Commenced 4 Jan 2021



The Shire of Gingin has commenced construction of the Gingin Outdoor Activity Space (GOAS) as of 4 January 2021.

This exciting project (situated adjacent to the Granville Civic Centre) is a community based

initiative and has been predominantly driven by the Gingin Outdoor Activity Space group (formerly Gingin Interactive Space Group), a community working group who came together to initiate and progress the development of a new outdoor activity space within the Gingin town site. The working group was independently formed in 2018 and is made up of several community members representing different demographics and/or interests in the community.

This project (formerly known as the Gingin Regional Playground) was instigated by the community given the aging and limited playground equipment in the Gingin town site. The original 'Gingin Regional Playground' project was to potentially relocate, renew and add to existing playground equipment for children. However, the project evolved over time given the need for an outdoor space that supported inclusion and engagement of all ages. The Working Group's vision 'is for a cohesive, accessible multigenerational outdoor recreational space within the centre of Gingin town.'

The Working Group has actively worked with the Shire at all stages of this project to ensure their vision is achieved. This has included independently undertaking fundraising activities and sourcing sponsorships (\$50,000), obtaining in-kind works and contributions (\$35,000) and securing \$150,000 in partnership with the Gingin CRC through a successful Bendigo Bank grant application. The Working Group also contributed to acquiring Federal funding with Hon. Christian Porter's support by meeting with him and discussing the project, the community's needs and the Working Group's role.

The Working Group continues to drive this project together with the Shire. The official launch of the Gingin Outdoor Activity Space is expected to coincide with Gingin's Sesquicentenary (150th Anniversary) which will take place 9 October 2021.



Music in the Park 2021

Despite a hectic week with a couple of major bush fires, Music in the Park 2021 wasn't about to be stopped following a year of COVID-19 and event cancellations left, right and centre.

This great event returned to Guilderton on Saturday, 9 January. An annual attraction, Music in the Park saw its biggest number of attendees ever this year. Families and friends trickled in the Gabbadah Park, which is something of a natural amphitheatre, to enjoy 4 hours of the great sounds of the 1950s from Johnny Law & the Pistol Packin Daddies. The Perth band's styles included Americana, Rockabilly, Country and Rock and Roll. It created plenty of grooving and jiving with one couple jumping up to show the rest how it's done early on in the evening.

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Gardening jobs for February:

- Deadhead roses – Fertilise with cow manure, and potash, or a special rose mixture. Spray with triflorine if black spot is evident.
 - Apply liquid fertiliser to fuchsias and cut back those that have finished flowering.
 - Keep annual and perennial flowers blooming by sprinkling with liquid fertiliser fortnightly
 - Dig potatoes and harvest onions when they are mature
 - Weed and fertilise vegetables, and pick crops regularly
 - Take softwood and semi-hardwood cuttings to grow new plants
 - Remove excessive runners from strawberry plants (keep runners to propagate more)
 - Re-pot cyclamen
- Spray apple and pear trees with carbaryl every three weeks to protect against codling and light brown apple moth.

Veges to sow: dwarf beans, beetroots, broccoli, Brussel sprouts, cabbages, carrots, cauliflowers, celery, chicory, Chinese cabbages, cress, endive, herbs, kohlrabi, leeks, lettuces, mustard, spring onions, parsnips, peas, potatoes, radishes, rhubarb, salsify, shallot bulbs, silverbeet, spinach, swedes, turnips.

Feed your lawn with liquid seaweed solution and soil wetter every fortnight to promote root growth in the lawn. Stronger roots allow the lawn to cope with heat, drought, and pests better. Results can be seen quickly once a regime of regular feed, water, and mowing is established. Remember to check the best mower height for your lawn type at this time of year, E.g. Buffalo lawns should be cut long currently. They are a stoloniferous and not rhizome turf and won't cope well if cut too short.

Techheads – Take regular photos of areas in your garden and compare them over time to see if they are improving, or to see whether there may be issues. Also, consider installing an app on your phone that easily identifies plants with just a photo taken on your phone. Some apps even have problem/pest identifiers built in and will guide you through how to resolve issues and remove pests.

CALL FOR REGIONAL HEALTH SERVICES REVIEW

I am calling for information on locations experiencing health services issues or equipment shortages. I am not convinced that the previous health services review has changed much at all for the bush. We still have doctors and equipment in places that do not need that volume and none in places we do. I'm also hearing that some places have equipment that can't be used due to staff shortages and lack of training.

All ideas are on the table, including encouraging new doctors out into regional WA after graduating. Throughout my 24-year policing career I have met many police officers who did not have want to go bush initially but after going most of them never return to the city, having fallen in love with regional WA. We encourage city people to try the country life but fail to provide the services to keep them there. It is particularly sad to see our elderly residents leave their beloved town to seek health services in metropolitan locations. Many of those people are also passionate volunteers in their community and this leaves a hole that often cannot be filled.

As a former police investigator, I am very familiar with conducting reviews on government processes so I am confident we can fix these issues. COVID-19 has taught us many other new ways to offer medical services so we need to capitalise on these initiatives. It just takes someone willing to make noise on behalf of the regional towns. 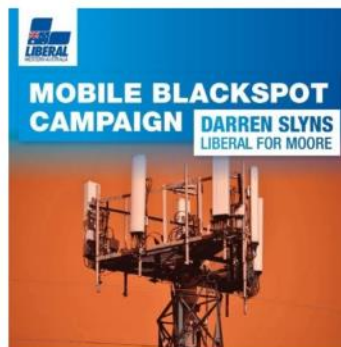
MOBILE BLACKSPOT CAMPAIGN

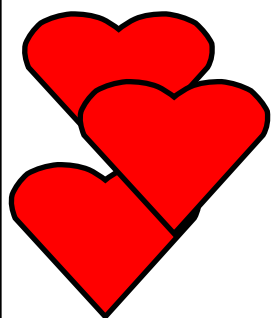

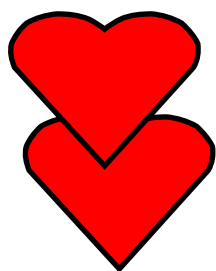
