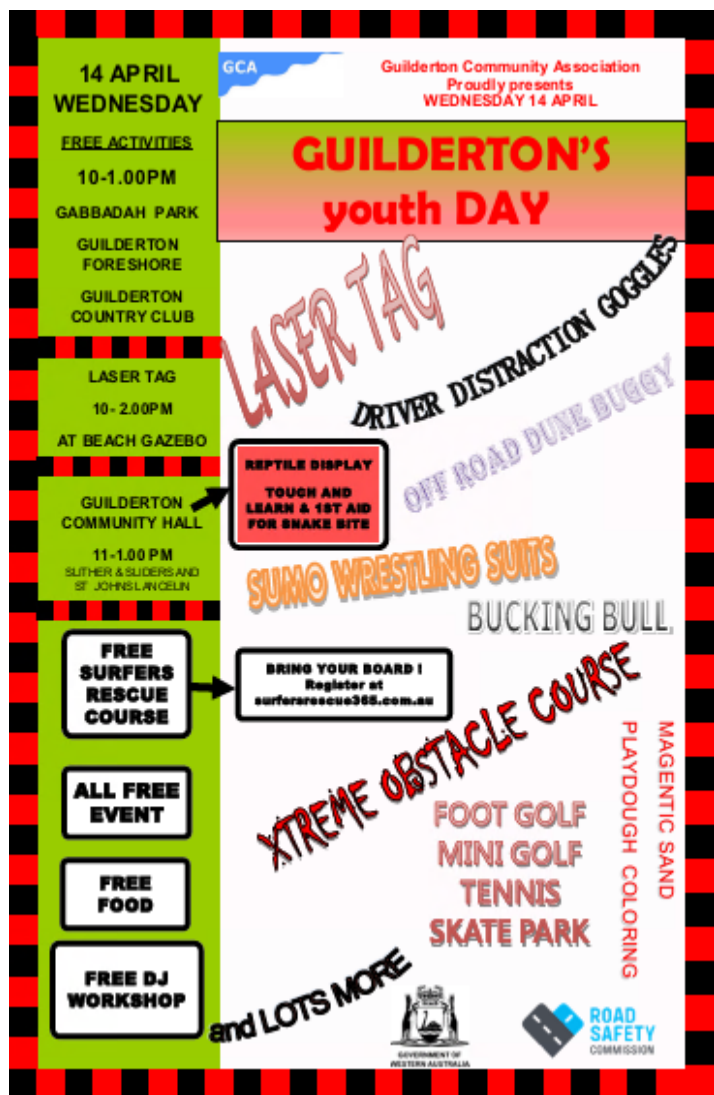

Well another busy month for our Volunteer Ambulance officers. We are all using the QR code when ever we enter a public place and this insures if there is a community outbreak we can be contacted. Hopefully this wont be the case.

Our volunteers had a very informative mock exercise recently in Lancelin. This was carried out by the Police, Fire and Ambulance officers. An amazing insight showing just how patients are excavated from severely smashed up cars after a bad accident.

Woodridge is holding several courses in April, see below. We, in this area, are so lucky to have these courses held often and so close to us.

I would urge everyone to learn CPR. This is not hard to achieve. I would also urge every one to look at and add an app to your phones. It is **St John's First Responder app**. It is an amazing app. **FREE** and when 000 is called it gives the exact location of where you are. Also tells you where the nearest doctor is, and nearest Defibrillator. One of the first questions the Communications person will ask you is your address, that's fine if you are home, but if you are not, and not sure where you are, ie on the road, you simply give them the coordinates. **EASY**. That then is transferred to the Ambulance and you will get help as quickly as possible.

Another suggestion to all. Have you got ambulance cover ????? Some folk are covered with their Health Fund, some private through St John, but alas some none at all. Check with Kate at our depot Tues or Thurs and ask about cover. A very inexpensive yearly subscription!!!! Pensioners are free.

Again I must remind everyone to stay safe. Look out for your neighbours and friends and be happy.

Recipe from the Craft Group's Comfort Cooking from the Cauldron

With the surplus of quinces about, we thought you might like to try this recipe.

Ingredients

4 quinces (about 1.25Kg) quinces, peeled, cored and coarsely chopped.

125ml (1/2 cup) water

700gm white sugar

Method

Combine the quince and water in a large saucepan over high heat, bring to boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer, covered, stirring occasionally for 30 minutes or until tender.

Place the quince mixture and sugar in a large, clean

saucepan. Place on a simmer mat over low heat and cook, stirring for 5 minutes until sugar dissolves. Reduce heat to very low and cook, stirring occasionally for 3 1/2 hours, or until mixture is ruby red, thick and leaves the side of the pan. Set aside for 15 minutes to cool.

Meanwhile, line the bases and sides of six 125ml (1/2 cup) capacity ramekins with plastic wrap.

Pour quince mixture evenly among ramekins and smooth surfaces. Cover and set aside for 6 hours or until set.

Do you need to do your Fire Breaks again?

There has been a little bit of rain this summer which has unfortunately resulted in sporadic fresh green growth around the Shire including on your fire breaks.

All property owners in the Shire of Gingin are required to maintain their fire breaks for the duration of the fire danger season which for our Shire, runs from 1 November until 31 May annually. This requirement is as per the *Bush Fires Act 1954* and the Fire Break Orders which are issued by the Shire to property owners annually in approximately August.

The Shire has received a large number of reports of fire breaks with fresh growth recently. It is important that you maintain your breaks because they are an indispensable defence method in the event of a bush fire. They not only act as an access track for emergency vehicles but they can also slow or halt the spread of grass fires and be used for back burning purposes.

Given two major bush fires have threatened properties and residents both this summer and last, there is no room for complacency. All property owners are reminded to check your fire breaks now. Inspections are ongoing throughout the Shire during the bush fire season and Fire Control Officers and Shire Rangers WILL issue infringements if your fire breaks do not meet the requirements of your Fire Break Orders.

The Shire is serious about bush fires and protecting properties and lives. Please do the right thing and make sure your fire breaks are maintained. This includes checking them yourself personally if you have had a contractor undertake your fire breaks because the responsibility of having maintained fire breaks lies with you as the property owner and not with any contractors that undertake this work for you.

Check your Fire Break Orders for your legal requirements on page 4. If you do not have a copy at home then you may view them on the Shire's website - www.gingin.wa.gov.au/fire-break-orders.

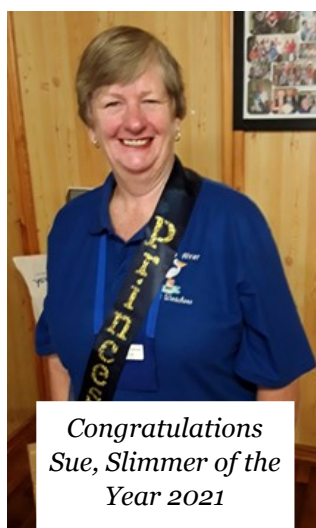

Results will hopefully support the WCA and those suffering residents to have the road resurfaced to reduce the noise emission to a more habitable level.

It is pleasing to now have the AED (defibrillator) back at the Woodridge Hall. We thank the Shire of Gingin for assisting us to have this covered under the Shire's insurance policy. Please keep an eye on this box, if you see it missing please contact the WCA committee asap. If anyone has any information on our stolen AED please contact Lancelin Police.

Thank you to the Shire of Gingin for installing a disability entrance at the Woodridge Hall and it has immediately been put to great use.

We are continuing the Masterplan for the upgrade to the Woodridge grounds, this will be ongoing.

Gardening in April



Vegetables to plant – [Seed] – Broad beans, Cabbage, cauliflower, celery, cress, garlic, herbs, lettuce, onion, radishes, shallots (bulb), silver beet, spinach, and turnip. [Seedling] – broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, celery, silver beet.

Tasks for the month

Pull out your spent Summer vegies. Add the disease free ones to your compost, or dig them in to break down. This is especially useful for any legume family plants, because they add nitrogen back into the soil.

Plant your Spring bulbs. Anemones (point down), and Ranunculus (claw down), give a wonderful display when they flower. Any other bulbs are planted with their points up.

Plenty of time to get those sweet peas in if you haven't already, and paper daisies can be hung to dry once they're blooming.

Feed your lawn. Your lawn has worked hard to stay green for Summer. Reward it with a feed. If the leaves of your lawn are looking a bit yellow, spray on Iron and Manganese to get it back to a rich green colour. Iron and Manganese won't feed your lawn, just get it back to colour. You'll still need to fertilise. Also, apply a soil wetting agent to your lawn to enable water to soak into the root system. Lawns are like icebergs, you only see the top 10/20% with 90% of the weight and work under ground. Grow a strong root system and you will be rewarded. Synthetic lawn fertilisers provide faster results than organic however organic will give you better results over time by adding organic matter to trap nutrients and water. Synthetic fertilisers also affect the microbiome in the soil.

Consider buying bulbs for friends and family instead of Easter Eggs. Bulbs will keep on giving year after year and your loved ones will be reminded of you when the bulbs bloom.

Dig in aged manure/dynamic lifter, and other aged organic matter. It can take weeks for them to provide what the nearby plants need from them and future crops will thank you.

It's a good time to plant grasses, like fountain grass, and strappy plants. They'll have enough time to take advantage of Winter rain and grow their root systems before next Summer.

Dust young cabbages and Brassicas to deter the cabbage moth and butterflies.

If you're looking to plant fruit trees, roses, or deciduous trees in Winter, start preparing the ground now.

Bottlebrushes will be thinking about a flush of bloom too. Cut away dead twigs and branches in the bushes to show off the beautiful greens, reds, and other colours the Callistemon displays so proudly.

Hopefully that will keep you busy for a little while. Wishing everyone a safe and happy Easter Break. Remember to show off your garden to anyone who visits. Be proud of your achievements. ☺ 🌱
