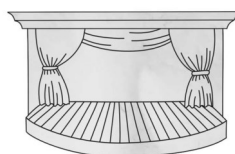


SOVEREIGN HILL GARDEN CLUB.

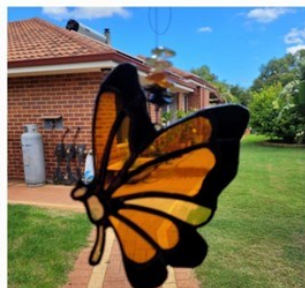
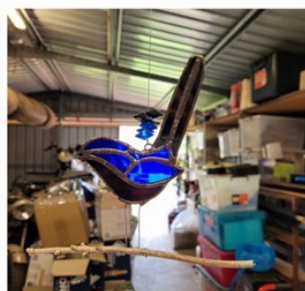

Pumpkin fruit cake (health & yummy)

- 1 cup mashed pumpkin
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 500 grams dried fruit
- 2 eggs
- 2 cups sr flour
- ¾ cup butter/marg
- 1 tsp mixed spice



Cook pumpkin the day before, mash and refrigerate
Grease a round cake pan and set the oven at 180 deg.
Rub butter into the flour, and mixed spice and sugar, add eggs and pumpkin
Mix through dry ingredients. The mixture must be wet.
Depending on the consistency, an extra egg or milk can be added
Pour into pan bake for 1 hr or when skewer comes out clean.

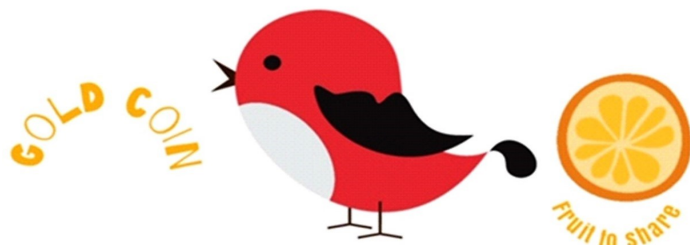

Evan has been involved with bushfire fighting himself for 23 years and comes to us from the Water Corporation where he held the position of Bushfire Mitigation Officer.



He continues to be an active member of the Wanneroo Central Bushfire Brigade where he has served as Lieutenant from 2018-2020 and Captain from 2020-22 before stepping back to a position as Crew Leader in May this year.

The position of BRMO covers the Shires of Gingin, Dandaragan and Victoria Plains, however Evan will undertake his tri-agency role primarily from the new Gingin Emergency Services Centre.

In his own words: "I'm looking forward to working across the three Shires to deliver mitigation treatments that have a direct impact to the safety of the community, and will lessen the impact of bushfire on the community in general."

Periodic Review of Local Laws

The Shire of Gingin is reviewing its current local laws in accordance with the provisions of Section 3.16 of the *Local Government Act 1995*. The local laws under review can be found on the Community Consultation page of the Shire's website gingin.wa.gov.au.

Members of the public are invited to make submissions in relation to any or all of the listed local laws as part of the review process. In order to be considered, submissions must be received by 4.00pm on Tuesday, 1 November 2022.

Time to Get Your Firebreaks Ready!

Owners and/or occupiers of land within the Shire of Gingin have a legal requirement under the *Bush Fires Act 1954* to install and maintain firebreaks from 1 November to 15 May every year.

Your firebreak should be 3 metres wide with a minimum vertical clearance of 4 metres to enable fire vehicles to drive along the firebreaks without access being obstructed.

Please don't leave your firebreaks until the last minute—start maintenance tasks now. For more information about firebreak compliance go to the Shire's Firebreak Orders & Bushfire Information by scanning the QR code.



Council Decisions

The following decisions were made by Council at the Shire's September Ordinary Council Meeting:

- Amendment of speed limit on section of Gingin Brook Road running from Brand Highway west to Coonabidgee Road from 110kph to 80kph to reduce danger to traffic—*approved by Council*.
- Re-establishment of Upper Coastal Sporting Facilities Working Group for purpose of undertaking a review of priorities within the Upper Coastal Sporting Facilities Master Plan—*approved by Council*.
- Exercise power of sale for Lot 339 Casuarina Drive, Nilgen for the recovery of rates—*approved by Council*.
- In addition, 12 other items were presented to / deliberated by Council.

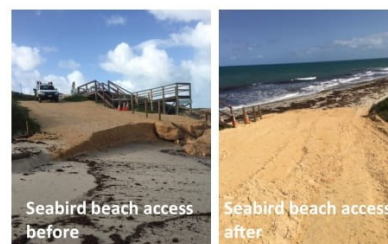
Our Coast, Our Journey—Nominate for the Coastal Planning Community Panel

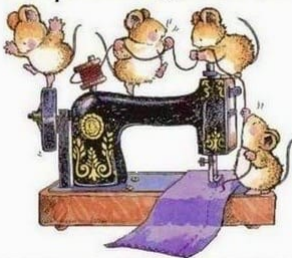

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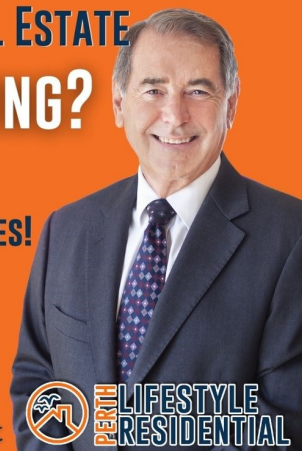
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Moore River Estuary

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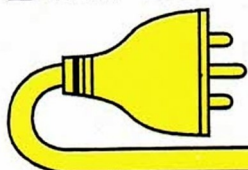

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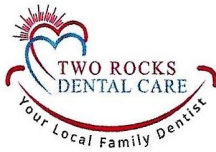
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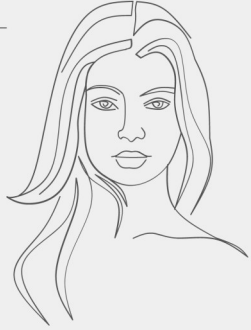
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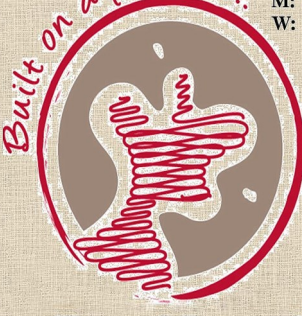


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Shires of Gingin / Chittering and the Northern Suburbs



Spring has sprung.

I was so excited I almost wet my plants. ☺

There is a lot to do in October with the weather warming, days getting longer, and the garden looking greener. Early flowering shrubs can be pruned and it's time to divide perennials. Regular weeding and deadheading is in the list to do and lawns will be looking for a feed and some water to kick start them and set them up for the growing season.

To do around the yard:

- If you haven't already, get your firebreaks done. If your yard isn't large enough to warrant a firebreak, walk around and pick up fallen tree limbs and rake up leaves. Mulch the leaves and compost or spread around garden beds. Whipper snip, slash, or mow long grass and weeds to keep potential fire fuel at a minimum. Cut and remove dead limbs from trees and shrubs, especially ones too close to power lines, overhanging buildings or fences. Hiring a professional to help is a good idea if the branches are large and/or high or in a difficult to reach spot and require specialised equipment.
- Water in recently planted trees and shrubs to assist in the development of their roots to help them cope during the warmer months.
- Prune early flowering shrubs as well as those grown for large or colourful foliage.
- Check for aphids on new shoots and wash off, spray, or attract beneficial bugs to help keep the aphids under control.
- Stake tall perennials such as foxgloves and hollyhocks, as they head up to flower.
- Pot up or transplant self-sown seeds. A client recently showed me a neat trick to keep the roly-pollys/and slaters by using plastic retic surrounds placed gently over the seedlings. The slaters can't get around the underside edge of the surround to get to the seedling.
- Keep weeding! It's been a massive year for weeds with the frequent rain and sun cycle. Once you've weeded the paths and driveways consider using a pathweed solution to prevent more weeds from appearing. For lawns, use a pre-emergent such as Barricade or Oxifert to prevent new seeds from germinating. Don't use a pre-emergent if you're going to overseed though because it will prevent the turf seed from germinating.
- Lawns - spray or hand pull weeds. If you have weeds in your lawn use a catcher when you mow to catch the weed seeds and not make a future problem for yourself. Leave the weed spray to act for a couple of weeks before mowing and then apply a fertiliser and wetting agent the week after mowing. Water in synthetic fertilisers to prevent chemical burns on your new turf. Lawns love seaweed solutions and extra iron and manganese to really make them pop with colour. Repair any patches, fill in holes, level out any bumps and dips, clear around retic heads, and test the retic to ensure even

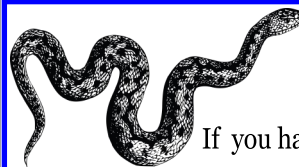
water coverage. Compost any cuttings from your lawn to spread on the garden later.

- Sow annual climbers and grasses
- Deadhead flowers and bulbs
- Sow and plant your Summer vegetables
- Prick out or pot up seedlings to prevent them getting leggy
- Remove any dead growth from perennials if you haven't already.
- Plant summer flowering bulbs, annual herbs, and force rhubarb.
- Plant up hanging baskets and pots for a Summer display of colour.

With the weather warming it is a great time to get that Summer vegetable garden started. Fresh corn, leeks, herbs, celery, pumpkins and potatoes always taste better straight from the garden and they're easy to grow. Plant in the garden, pots, or straight into the bag from the nursery/hardware store. Just remember to punch a few holes for drainage in the bags and cut the top open for the soil to breathe. Once the vegetables are finished and harvested the bag contents can be spread around the garden beds.

Veggies to plant in October: Seed - french bean, beetroot, broccoli, cabbage, capsicum, carrot, cauliflower, celery, cucumber, eggplant, lettuce, marrow, melon, parsnip, pea, pumpkin, radish, pea, pumpkin, radish, silverbeet, spinach, sweetcorn, tomato, zucchini. Seedlings - cabbage, capsicum, cauliflower, celery, eggplant, leek, tomato. Stagger planting of the same vegetable for a longer harvest season.
