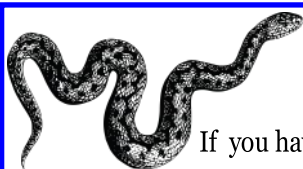
Dear Readers

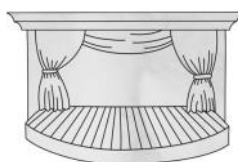

Hopefully your gardens are a mass of colour and activity. Flowers are blooming, lawns are lush and green, bees and birds are busy doing their thing.

Lawns - Mow a little higher than usual to shade the roots and have more leaf area for photosynthesis to develop deeper roots for the coming hot weather. Check for pests and treat as required. It's a good time to finalise any renovation work (reseed, top dress, compost, light de-thatch, scarify, etc) you may have wanted to do as well. Apply wetting agents to lawns if you didn't last month. It really helps. Lawns love seaweed, worm wee and fish emulsion solutions just like other plants too.

Veges to sow - Seed - Cabbage, capsicum, carrot, cucumber, eggplant, lettuce, marrow, melon, pumpkin, radish, silver beet, sweetcorn, zucchini. Seedlings - cabbage, capsicum, eggplant, silver beet.

If you haven't already, test reticulation systems and timing. Replace damaged sprinkler heads and check for leaks, blockages, and damaged pipes. Set up timing for the warmer conditions.

Prune any Spring flowering shrubs once they have finished flowering. Trim box and other formal hedges lightly to keep shape and promote bushing. Take any cuttings from herbaceous perennials. Plant out dahlias if you haven't already. Deadhead roses and other Spring annuals. Thin out clusters of stone fruit if the crop is heavy. Repot geraniums, lavender and other evergreen shrubs in containers. Check your plants for pests and treat as required. Please pick up any fallen fruit, including citrus, to reduce fruit fly infestations. Place traps and sticky paper to catch unwanted flying pests near your fruit trees. Tuck straw under strawberries to keep the fruit off the ground and cover with netting if you have a problem with birds pinching the fruit. Pull off the runners if you don't want to propagate. This diverts the energy back to fruit production. Feed fruit trees, especially citrus. They are gross feeders and require regular feeding to produce fruit. Net flowering fruit trees once the fruit is set to keep the birds off.

Hoe bare ground to help control weeds. Move fuchsias and other hanging and potted plants to best show them off. Prune evergreen hibiscus - Don't be shy and cut back to a third of last years growth. Prune Clementis Montana after it has flowered and tie climbers back. Grapevines will need tying back and checking for pests and disease. The dense growth can hide some nasties so have a good look. Feed Spring flowering bulbs now. They store the energy now for next years flowering. Cut back alyssum, arabis and aubrieta. They get a bit daggy and bare. Lift and divide mint and plant out basil seedlings. Think ahead now for a festive display of colour. Plant flowering seedlings now to have them showing their beautiful colour over the Summer months.

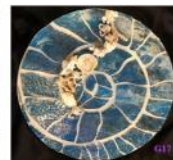

DRINK DRIVING DON'T TAKE THE RISK

Lancelin Police have charged 11 people for drink driving in the last 4 months.

We're frustrated and disappointed. Please don't take the risk, not only are the court penalties severe – imagine killing an innocent road user.

Drink Driving & Disorderly Behaviour Conviction

On the afternoon of Saturday 26th the March, an intoxicated 27-year-old male was asked to leave a licensed premise, entered his vehicle and started the engine. A courageous member of the public rushed over to the vehicle, turned off the engine and took the keys out of the ignition. The male became disorderly and attempted to assault the member of public. Police attended and arrested the male. On the 15th September the male was convicted in the Joondalup Magistrates Courts of 1) Drove a Motor Vehicle Under the Influence of Alcohol, 2) Disorderly Behavior in a Public Place and 3) Disorderly Behavior in a Police Station. **The male was fined nearly \$5000 fines and his driver's licence suspended for 30 months.** Thank you to the member of the public who potentially saved the offenders life and the lives of others on the road.

LOWER MOORE RIVER WORKING GROUP

The Lower Moore River Working Group would like to extend a welcome invitation to attend our Annual General Meeting. The meeting will be held at the Guilderton Country Club on Sunday 13th November 2022 at 9.30am. This year we have invested in a new dual axle watering/work trailer and battery tools. Our old watering trailer will be available for sale soon if any interest, please contact us. Our replanting from years ago is now fully established and new habitats for fauna have been formed. Another 200 Banksia Trees have been planted in the Silver Creek reserve. We also are trying to restrict access to a bird nesting and aquatic breeding area there also.

Unfortunately, the Boardwalk we build many years ago and maintained for its life remains closed off by the shire. They will be looking at replacing the structure, but the shire are unable to confirm current progress

Fencing to protect sensitive riparian zones from livestock breaches continues to be a challenge. We often require some fit and able bodies to assist in these tasks.

The Japanese Pepper trees infestation has been an issue for many years. We arranged a large focussed eradication in the Lower Moore River both on the Northern and Southern banks which has been highly successful, however with many trees on private properties, as birds continue to spread the seeds, this will be a continued problem. We will commence soon a record of Japanese Peppers on private property and work with owners to eradicate these trees with an additional funding grant.

We are seeking new committee members and volunteer workers for fencing, planting, maintenance etc. If you have interest in joining or just assisting in our volunteer works, please either attend the AGM, email lmrwg@hotmail.com or join us on Facebook.
