CRAFTY PATCH



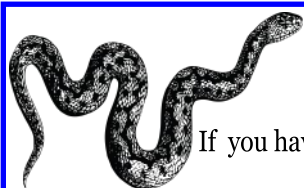

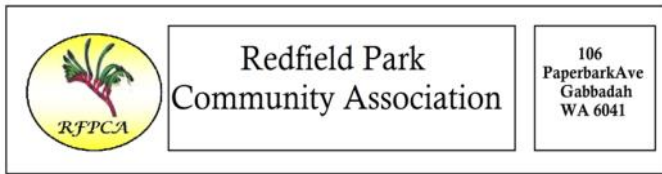


This month's Games day we had a small group but still enjoyed playing Banagrams, Luck Plus and Phase 10.

Why the Shire Disables Comments on Social Media



We've received queries from the public about why we disable comments on Shire Facebook posts.

Historically, the Shire of Gingin embraced social media as a useful two-way means of communication with our communities.

However, in recent years we've had to deal with – as have most public service organisations – increasingly hostile, divisive, and unreasonable online interaction from the public, usually because of a decision or course of action the Shire has made that people don't like or agree with, which then results in lengthy and sometimes vicious diatribes on Facebook. This makes responding by Shire officers in a constructive and meaningful way almost impossible.

Also, local governments are bound to recordkeeping policies and regulations which apply to electronic media communication. We simply do not have the resources to monitor, moderate, respond to and record all the threads, comments, and posts on our Facebook page. For this reason, and in the interests of transparency, we do our best to 'share' our posts to the various community group Facebook pages in the region where members of the public can make whatever comment they wish.

In saying that, if you have read or heard something about the Shire that is of concern to you, we strongly encourage you to either give us a call on 9575 5100 or send us an email to mail@gingin.wa.gov.au in the first instance so we can clarify our position and provide you with the facts. By doing so, you will help to shut down rumour mills that cause confusion and angst in your community.

While we respect everyone's right to their opinion, we also reserve the right to moderate social media communication in a way that we see fit and appropriate for our organisation.

KW-Sappers Road Intersection Upgrade Complete



A total reconstruction of the KW-Sappers Road intersection is now complete. The project included widening of the intersection and turning circumference to safely accommodate road trains and school buses, as well as a slip lane and asphalt renewal.

The works were undertaken by the Shire's Operations team and took 4 weeks to complete.

The project was funded by the Wheatbelt Secondary Freight Network.

Other completed projects:

- Seabird Oval – old fencing removed around oval and cricket nets.
- Seabird Hall – patio repaired.
- Bootine Road - floodway replaced.
- Lancelin Back Beach ablutions – roof and verandah replaced.
- Gingin Cattleyards – new stairs and safety railing installed.
- GOAS - timber fencing installed on east side of playground.
- Gingin Pioneer Park Pavilion – upgraded and painted.

Lancelin Skate Park Stage 2 Upgrade to Commence

Work is expected to start soon on the Stage 2 upgrade of the Lancelin Skate and BMX Park. Playspace designer PHASE 3 was the successful tenderer of the project which will include removal of the rusted metal ramps, upgrades to the quarterpipes, pimple, bowl and pump tracks, and resolving drainage issues. The approximate value of the project is \$440,000 including GST.

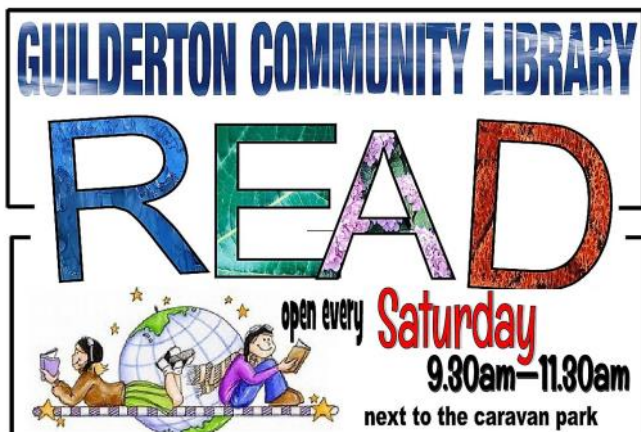

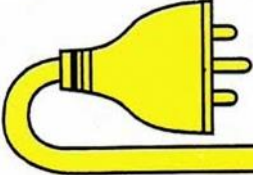

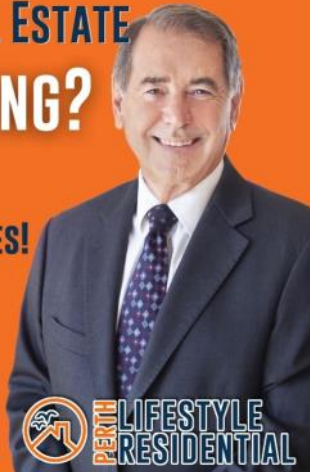

IN PRAISE OF GUILDERTON

In 2015 Guilderton won the national Keep Australia Beautiful 'Clean Beach' award. We beat Burleigh Heads on the Gold Coast and Coles Bay in Tassie with the judges astonished at what our little community was achieving. The projects that led to our entry were achieved by 1. the Lower Moore River Working Group, who made and maintained the Stephens Crescent boardwalk and looked after the bush on the riverbank.

2. Moore Catchment Council who found grants to create the interpretive signage along the foreshore, at the lookout, etc. MCC also made possible the north dunes project which saw 22ha fenced from 4WDs and rehabilitated, with a new walk trail as well, and is now working on other bush in town. MCC also found funding for the pyp grass control program which is ongoing and have been working with us for years.

3. Gingin Shire who built the lookout staircase which was opened in 2015. They worked with our Yued community on a Reconciliation Action Plan which included Guilderton too.

Tracey, our beloved Shire gardener was keeping the town tidy and well maintained and the cleaners did their best with what, even then, was facilities due for replacement. The town looked good and cared for.

4. Guilderton Community Association who provided volunteers for so many projects e.g. all the above plus our Visitor Centre and Library. For many years GCA did Clean Up Australia every March working with Scouts, 4WDers as well as locals and visitors.

Every Easter, Moore Arts hold an exhibition and sale, cooperating with the golf club who hold their fundraising cake and bric-a-brac stalls. GCA supports the Mens Shed, the Country, golf and bowls clubs in their endeavours in the town.

5. Friends of Moore River Estuary who protect the estuary in their opposition to a suburb at Moore River south and also monitor the estuary water quality and work with wider groups such as DBCA and NACC on issues affecting the coast of our area.

There were so many people, doing so much in such a little town that WE WON.

Most of what we were doing then, we are still doing, and more; so what has changed to raise the anger of so many that they need to hold a protest??
