Council Rejects Petition Request to Stand Down Shire CEO

Further to a petition presented to the Gingin Shire Council last month calling for the removal of the Shire's CEO Mr Aaron Cook, Council resolved at its Ordinary Meeting on 18 April to decline taking any action to remove Mr Cook. The decision was made on the grounds that claims made in the petition were without basis.

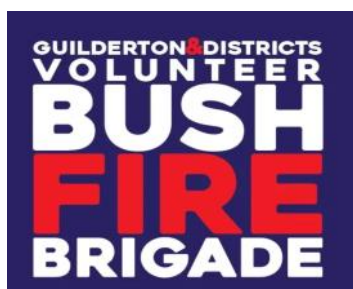

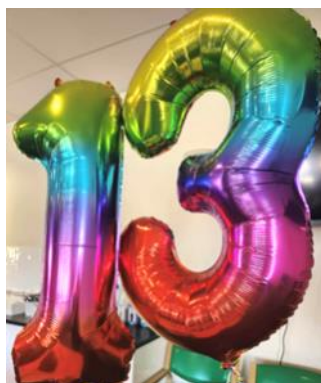
GUILDERTON COUNTRY CLUB

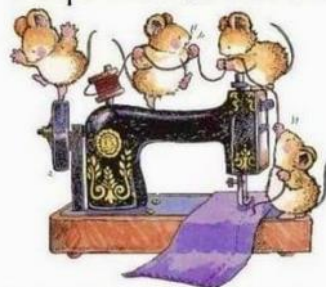

COUNCIL TO COMMUNITY

Gingin Bowling Club Roof Restoration

The roof restoration project for the Gingin Bowling Club is now complete. This Shire capital works project involved internal strengthening of roof structure, repair and painting of the eaves and fascia, removal of redundant evaporative air conditioners, as well as external roof restoration and high-pressure cleaning.

The project was undertaken by MidWest Building, Billy Ellwood Building Services, and Roof Restorers Perth, and took approximately 4 weeks to complete.



Upcoming Projects

As we head into the cooler seasons, our Operations teams will be undertaking the following works and projects in the coming months:

Asset Works

- Removing bore stains, internal upgrades ie, hot water systems to bathrooms, kitchen upgrades at Gingin Bowling Club.
- Pre & post emergent application to sports turf in Lancelin and Gingin.
- Replacement of ~30 fence posts at Ledge Point tennis courts.
- Topping up soft fall at GOAS playground plus timber staining of original fence to match new.
- Major internal renovation to DeBurgh St ablution block, Ledge Point.
- External works including drains at CU@Park to combat winter water ingress issues.
- Relocating ambulance access gate and overflow carpark works at Guilderton Bowling Club.
- Drainage, replacement of fence with colorbond, and garden works at Treasure Trove building.

Road Maintenance Works

- Annual slashing, drain clearing, and weed spraying duties around the Shire.
- Curbing repairs to a number of sites in Guilderton.
- Street sign install and replacement of damaged signage, Gingin, Guilderton, and along Gingin Brook Road.

Construction Works

- Annual road maintenance grading program commenced.
- Seabird seawall maintenance commenced.

Restricted Burning Period in Effect

The Shire of Gingin entered its autumn Restricted Burning Period on 15 April and permits to burn are available from Fire Control Officers and online from the Shire's website gingin.wa.gov.au/fire-information.

Fire pits, BBQs and 1m x 1m single pile fires will be permitted without a permit between 6pm and 11pm as per the 2022/23 Firebreak Orders, and all other conditions apply.

The autumn Restricted Burning Period will conclude on 15 May when the Shire enters its Unrestricted Burning Period on 16 May, unless otherwise advised due to weather conditions.

Sowing time!

Vegetables – Artichoke suckers, beetroot, broad beans, broccoli, capsicum, carrots, cress, garlic (last chance), lettuce, mustard, onions, spring onions, peas, radishes, shallot bulbs, spinach, microgreens on the windowsill.



Lawns – Keep an eye out for weeds. Pull/spray as soon as you see them and get them out before they go to seed. Some weeds like wintergrass leave a divot when you pull/dig them out. Fill the divots with lawn topsoil. One year's seed, seven years weed! With lawn growth slowing it's a good time to get the lawnmower serviced and sharpened/blades replaced, for when it's needed.

Plant lillies until the Spring, check stored bulbs. Start planting tulips this month.

Protect young plants from rabbits, start gathering fallen leaves and mulching/composting them, sow green manure crops, check and prep any cold frames heat pads aren't too expensive (shop around) if you're thinking of getting some). Prep beds and areas for deciduous trees, fruit trees, and other plants you're planning for Winter planting.

Check tree stakes and ties.

Shield vulnerable plants, plant bare root roses.

Get your power tool serviced to prep them for Winter hedging and pruning. Check blades are sharp and moving parts are lubricated. Service chainsaws and hedgers now in preparation for Winter pruning and firewood preparation.

Consider the desired shape of young trees and shrubs planted last year. Visualise what you want them to look like and ensure you have the tools and knowledge for how and when to shape them.

Cut back ornamental grasses and bamboos. Propagate rhubarb.

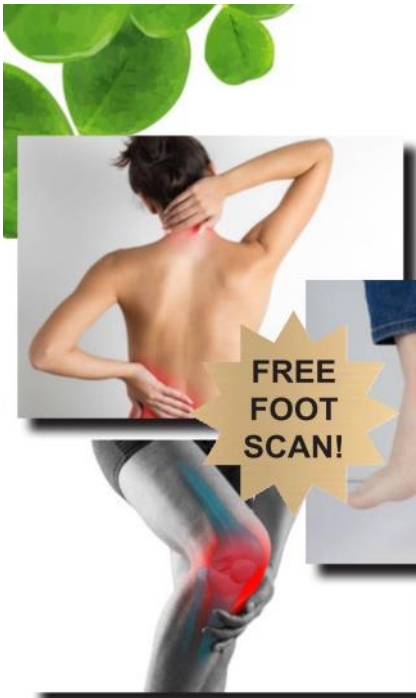

Sovereign Hill Community Hall. The Sov Hill committee met with the Shire and it is hoped there will be a successful outcome.

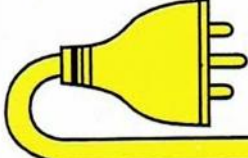
A round table discussion brought up some new ideas and each community group was quick to add their own outcomes and to feed other groups with solutions.

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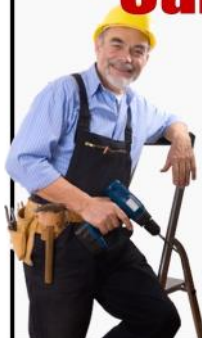

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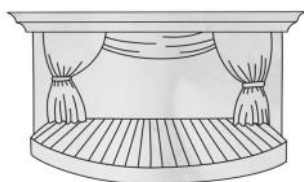

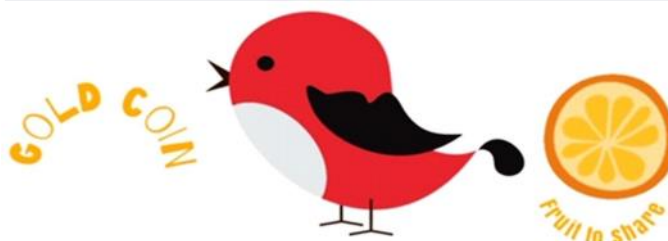
