#### Sun City Group New Operator for Guilderton Café

At a Special Council Meeting on 30 May 2023, the Shire of Gingin agreed to reassign the existing commercial lease for the Guilderton Café and General Store from Belgravia Health & Leisure Group Pty Ltd to Sun City Group Pty Ltd.

Sun City Group, owned and managed by John Young and family, has been operating the supermarket at the general store location next to the café as a sub-lessee since 2022.



Following the closure of the café back in January this year, Belgravia Leisure called for expressions of interest for café operators and of the 18 candidates who made submissions, Sun City Group's application was the strongest and most appropriate.

"Their demonstrated track record within the current premises and their adaptability regarding the café's operation made them the most suitable choice," said Belgravia Leisure WA State Manager, Rohan Gunton.

Gingin Shire President, Wayne Fewster added: "During the period that the Young family have been operating the supermarket in Guilderton, we've received nothing but positive feedback from the community on the terrific service they are providing.

"We are really pleased with this outcome and look forward to working with John and Sun City Group to see this facility open and providing the community and visitors with great service once again."

The reassignment of the lease to Sun City Group is effective 1 June 2023 and it is expected that Sun City Group will transition into the café space over the coming weeks.

Sun City Group Managing Director, John Young said: "We are hoping to bring to Guilderton and surrounds a really good hospitality experience, and we're looking forward to giving locals and visitors something to enjoy."

As the café re-establishes, Sun City Group will provide updates to the community.



PLEASE SLOW DOWN when you see black cockies drinking from puddles by the side of the road. It should be common sense but obviously it's not for everyone.

These gorgeous birds are slow to take off so need abit of time and space to get high enough to avoid a car. I came across 3 hit on Indian Ocean Rd a month ago. 2 sadly were dead and one alive, still in the middle of the road with cars zooming over her.

She was lucky enough to survive with bad bruising and a damaged eye and after a week at the zoo hospital is now being rehabilitated at the Native Animal Rescue in Malaga.

If you find an injured bird please get them to the local vet where they will be picked up by the Carnaby rescue group or better still get them to the zoo or Native Animal Rescue( 92493434) yourself, keeping them covered and the car quiet to avoid further shock and stress.

Main Roads and DBCA have been informed and hopefully will be looking to put signs up to make people aware they feed and fly low through that area. With their banksia woodland disappearing along the coastal strip, Gnangara pines being cleared as well as other habitat and food threats these already endangered beautiful birds could be extinct within 20 years .EXTINCTION IS FOREVER.

Although it is a comparatively short course at only 4621 yards for 18 holes, the course will provide a challenging round of golf for both novices and experienced golfers alike.



#### **Gardening Tips for July**

Veges to sow: artichoke, asparagus crowns, broad bean, beetroot, broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower, capsicum, cress, garlic, lettuce, onions, leek, potatoes, radish, salsify, spinach, peas, silver beet, and early tomatoes.



Flowers to sow:candytuft, larkspur, alyssum, cineraria, forget-me-not, lupin, poppies, stock

#### **Jobs for mid Winter**

- - Rake fallen leaves. Use them for mulch and composting.
- ◆ Shift roses or plant new ones now. Deadhead roses and give a good prune
- It's a great time to propagate deciduous trees and vines. Grapevines can be struck now if you're wanting more
- ◆ Finish pruning dormant fruit trees now, including grapevines.
- - Apply liquid fertiliser to vegetable seedlings
- Prune fuschias to two-thirds their size, cutting just above a bud
- Spray dormant fruit trees with oil, adding copper or lime sulphur to prevent gall wasp and other pests
- ◆ Lawns Winter weeds are in full swing. Treat with selective herbicides if there appears to be more weeds than turf, or, pull up by hand.
- Keep spraying citrus fruit trees with trace elements regularly. Applications of pest controls and nutrients should be done with time between each. Apply pest control one week and nutrients the following week. Stone and pome fruits benefit with a watering can

application of trace elements. Check the instructions if you're not sure.

Maintain, sharpen, and lubricate garden tools.

Now is good time to get petrol powered equipment serviced before the next growing season kicks in.





#### **Lancelin Projects Completed**

It's been a while in the planning but the redevelopment of the **Cunliffe Foreshore area** in Lancelin is finally complete.

Works included:

- Re-design of existing Cunliffe Street parking to delineate parking bays and improve access.
- Installation of grassed areas at the north and south end of Cunliffe Street parking areas to improve amenity and also provide





· Line-marking for parking bays.

The Cunliffe Foreshore redevelopment budget was \$588,000 of which \$250,000 has been funded from Australian Government's Community Development Grants Program.

Also recently completed has been the Stage 2 upgrade of the **Lancelin Skate Park** located in Wangaree Park—and just in time for the school holidays.

Undertaking the project was playspace designer PHASE 3 and works included removal of rusted metal ramps, upgrades to the quarter-



pipes, pimple, bowl and pump track, and resolving drainage issues.

The Lancelin Skate Park Stage 2 upgrade budget was \$400,000 of which \$286,000 has been funded from the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program.

#### Dog Owner Responsibilities—Reminder!

Whether you are a resident, visitor or tourist and own a dog, YOU have responsibilities. These are outlined by the *Dog Act* 1976 which states owners must ensure their dog:

- Wears a collar displaying a current registration tag while in public places.
- Can be confined to the premises where
  it lives
- Is held by a competent person capable of controlling a dog on a maximum two-metre lead when in public places.
- In designated areas, dogs may be exercised off a lead, but the dog must be under control and the person in control of the dog must carry a lead in case it is required.
- Is registered in one person's name who is over the age of 18 years.

Please be aware there are **on-the-spot fines** which may be issued for non-compliance. For more information on responsible dog ownership in the Shire of Gingin visit *gingin.wa.gov.au/dogs.*

So the shop was closed for 13 days while we removed all the furniture, patched and mended walls,




repainted, ripped out the carpet, relaid new tiles, fitted skirting boards, revamped the kitchen cabinets and then put everything back in with a new layout.





#### **Hoon Charged**

On Sunday May 28<sup>th</sup> a 'Hoon' from Perth came to Lancelin and decided it was a good idea to do a burn-out at the Lancelin Information Bay. A 28-year-old male from Perth was tracked down by our team and on June 17<sup>th</sup> he was charged with Reckless Driving & his car impounded for the offence.

#### **Emergency Services – Welfare Information Session**

Due to the regular critical and fatal incidents our local Emergency Service personnel continue to attend, Lancelin Police facilitated a joint emergency services welfare information session in Lancelin on Tuesday June 6<sup>th</sup>. Clinical Psychologist Philip Makarios from the WA Police Force Psychology Unit briefed personnel from our local St John Ambulance, Volunteer Fire & Rescue Service, Volunteer Marine Rescue, Silver Chain and Police. The session was very well attended and gave all of our partners some very useful advice for looking after ourselves and our teams, as we regularly attend to and deal with traumatic incidents. To best look after the community, we need to be healthy ourselves. Thank you very much to the SJA team for hosting the session and to Terrie James and her team for cooking up another delightful spread.

#### Hefty Fine for Distribution of an Intimate Image

In February this year, we charged a 39-year-old female from Woodridge with 'Distributing an intimate image of another person without consent' after an investigation into the matter. On the 8<sup>th</sup> of May the offender plead guilty in the Joondalup Magistrates Court, was fined \$5,600 and the Magistrate ordered the destruction of her mobile phone, which was used to facilitate the offence.


