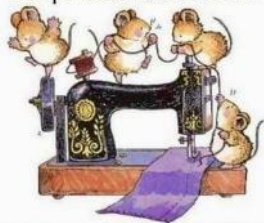

GUILDERTON VISITOR CENTRE

Did you know when Guilderton was connected to the power grid? Well, continue reading these interesting facts taken from John Princes "Secret No Longer" to find out.

A letter was written to the State Electricity Commission requesting that power be extended to Guilderton in 1972 and again in 1973. All of which were rejected. Then in 1974 another letter was written informing the SEC that there were now 20 residents, a caravan park, store, the proposed construction of a roadhouse and extensions to the Country Club were planned and all required power. At this time power was slowly making its way towards the coast from Gingin but it was still some years off.

Then in 1975 after a survey of residents the SEC made available Connection Application Forms. After a few more obstacles were overcome power was finally connected in May/June 1976 and the first street light 2 years later.

- You do not have to be a member of one of the local Community Associations.

- Anyone can attend meeting but in order to vote you must be a member.
- The meeting in Guilderton Hall at 7.00pm on the 18th October will start with voting in a committee from members.
- Meetings will be held four times a year moving around to each community, the January one will be in Neergabby.

Incorporating will give a stronger voice to our communities when dealing with either local, state or federal government. Plus a much stronger ability to request grants.

The great news is that the Gingin Shire might donate \$10,000 towards our community bus project. Plus the Bendigo Bank came to our last meeting and might also contribute. The Guilderton Country Club has been our spokesperson recently but now the LCCA will take over because of the incorporation.

Vegetables -

This Month's Tasks - Take cuttings from succulents and pot into a sandy soil mix.

Fertilise newly planted Summer annuals and shrubs. Divide and re-pot Cymbidium orchids, Dethatch spongy lawns with a rake (scarify for really spongy), prune Bottlebrush Stems once flowers brown off, pick flowering sweet pea to prolong flowering, spray weeds in pavers, driveways and open areas. Hand weed garden beds and spray/pull out any remaining lawn weeds, Start increasing watering times for garden beds and lawns, apply wetting agents to lawns. Apply selective herbicides to finish off the lawn weeds, carry out reticulation checks to ensure everything is ready for the coming season. Repair damaged reticulation. Mulch garden beds and fruit trees, seal terracotta pots in preparation of the heat. Watch out for and treat aphids/pests on roses and wherever they occur, watch out for Citrus leaf miner and

Colour planting - Cana Lily, Coreopsis, Twinspur, Sunflower, Impatiens, Geranium, Petunia, and Nasturtium.

other pests, treating as necessary. Prep tomato planting beds, add dynamic lifter to your citrus and start the trace element spraying on citrus and any plants showing nutrient deficiencies.

Vegetables/herbs to plant - basil, beans, cabbage, chilli, leeks, mint, savory, tomatoes, broccoli, capsicum, celery, eggplant, luffa, pumpkin, spinach, squash, tomatillo, zucchini, marrow, rockmelon, sweet corn, cucumber, beetroot, carrot, lettuce, parsley, potato, rocket, silverbeet, sunflower, asparagus, burdock, chicory, endive, Jerusalem artichoke, mustard greens, sage, snow peas, chives, fennel, kohlrabi, rhubarb, salsify, spring onions, turnips.

It's a busy time in the garden this month with plenty to do before the beautiful Summer season gets here. Gardening is great exercise and calming for the soul. Every time I mow someone's lawn, prune their trees, give some advice, or help get the reticulation sorted and ready I feel a sense of accomplishment and love to see the results when it all comes to fruition. Seeing the results of your labours in the garden is great for your self-esteem and helping you feel better.

Dog & Cat Registrations Reminder

Dog and cat registrations are coming up for renewal on the **31 October**.

All dogs and cats within the Shire of Gingin are required by law to be registered as follows:

Dogs - Age **3 months** and over

Cats - Age **6 months** and over

A few things to be mindful of:

- If you are a new resident to the Shire of Gingin, you need to carry out a Registration Transfer for your pet.
- Let us know if your pet has passed away.
- Ensure that your contact details are up to date. Please advise us of change of address in writing by emailing mail@gingin.wa.gov.au.

If you are a **stock owner**, please make sure our Rangers Department has your NLIS tag number and your contact details in case of an escapee as this makes it far easier for Rangers to locate the owner of lost stock.

Greenwaste Kerbside Collection

Each year the Shire of Gingin undertakes a green waste kerbside collection service for Residential and Rural Residential properties. This year's collection is scheduled to follow the King's Birthday Long Weekend which falls on 23-25 September. Residents wishing to take advantage of this service will need to have green waste placed on the verge no later than **Monday 25 September 2023**. Please remember there are conditions for collection which include that piles must not be contaminated or be larger than 5m³. Visit gingin.wa.gov.au for all collection criteria information.

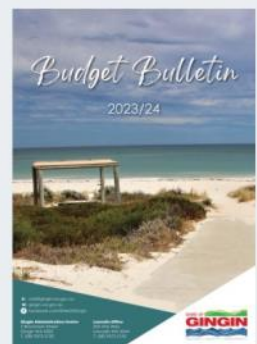

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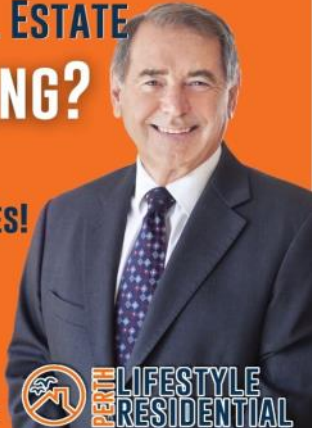
