Moore Arts Council Art & Craft Market

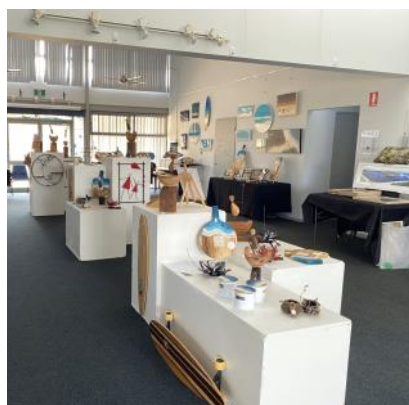

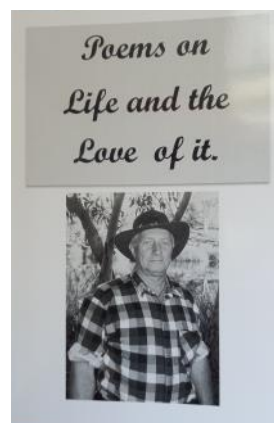

As I've mentioned in my previous articles, we are all subject to the ever-growing stress and demands of everyday life. Stress is our body's response to everyday pressures, and we all deal with stress in our own unique ways.

Stress is a natural human response that prompts us to address challenges and threats in our lives; however when the stresses in life get too much for us, we can start to feel overwhelmed. Stress can affect us in many ways including feelings of irritability, anger, impatience, feeling anxious or even afraid, unable to enjoy ourself, depressed and sometimes even uninterested in life.

Mindful breathing exercises, positive affirmations and using distraction techniques are all ways of grounding and calming yourself when you are starting to feel overwhelmed and anxious.

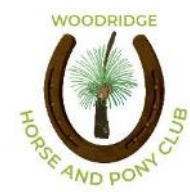
Online apps such as the Stress & Anxiety Companion and the Catch It app can help to teach you how to look at problems in a different way and help turn negative thoughts into positive ones.

Jane Fisher

HI Everyone

I'm Jane Fisher, many of you have met me before when I've visited Woodridge Pony club, but no doubt there's new faces and I'm terrible with names.

I've been riding horses since I was 4 years old. I came from a non horsie family, so I had to wait until I was 14 until I got a horse of my own thank goodness for grandmas.

Back in the day you would search the Sunday times equestrian page for buy/sell horses. You would beg your parents to go out late Saturday night to get the Sunday Times because you didn't want to miss out on "the one"! So, my first horse was a \$350 Sunday times special include saddle and bridle. He was a 15hh pinto gelding, unregistered no papers. Later we found out he had been a rescue from the knackers.

By the time I finished with him he was dual registered paint and pinto. Won at the Royal Show. Multi champion in hand and under saddle. Competed official hacking – which was a big no for coloured horses back in the 1980s / 90s, competed dressage successfully and did the odd ODE.

My passion became turn out and presentation. I loved everything about making sure he and I were turned out perfectly. My instructor taught me how to do rosettes and from the beginning I sewed them in. They would take me hours and hours because to me they had to be perfect. I taught myself to braid on friends' hair and practiced and practiced on his tail until I could do the perfect tail braid and forelock braid. My dad would help me get his white legs white ready to step foot in the ring. It was very rare we lost a best presented class in hand or under saddle.

Over the years I have had many people ask me to plait and present their horses for them because they have seen the presentation of my horses.

I have competed in Show Horse, Show Hunter and Rider classes at WA HOTYs and Perth Royal show. I was Champion Senior rider at 2021 Perth Royal Show and was Runner up small Show Hunter hack in 2020, and my hunter won countless champion child's hunter at Royal Show and HOTYs.



I now have a warmblood stallion who has just been broken in. I have owned him since he was 5 days old. I have successfully shown him in hand for a number of Supreme of Supreme wins. I look forward to my dressage journey with him.

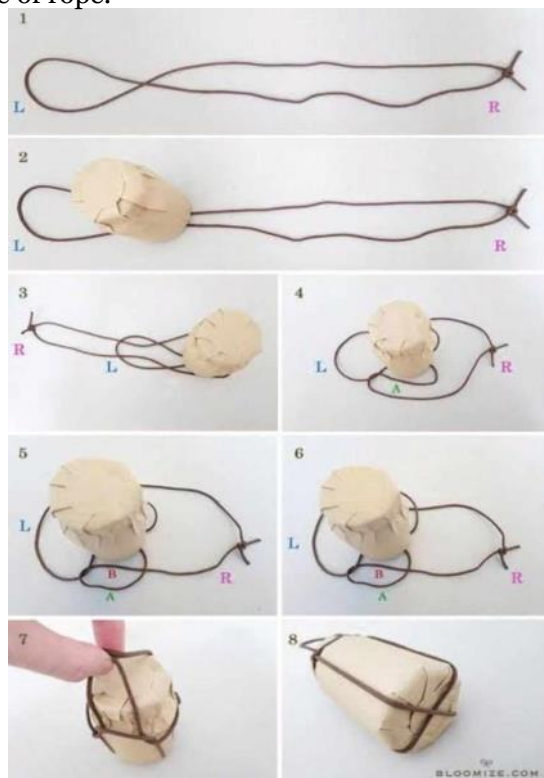
Sovereign Hill Garden Club

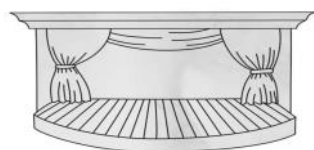
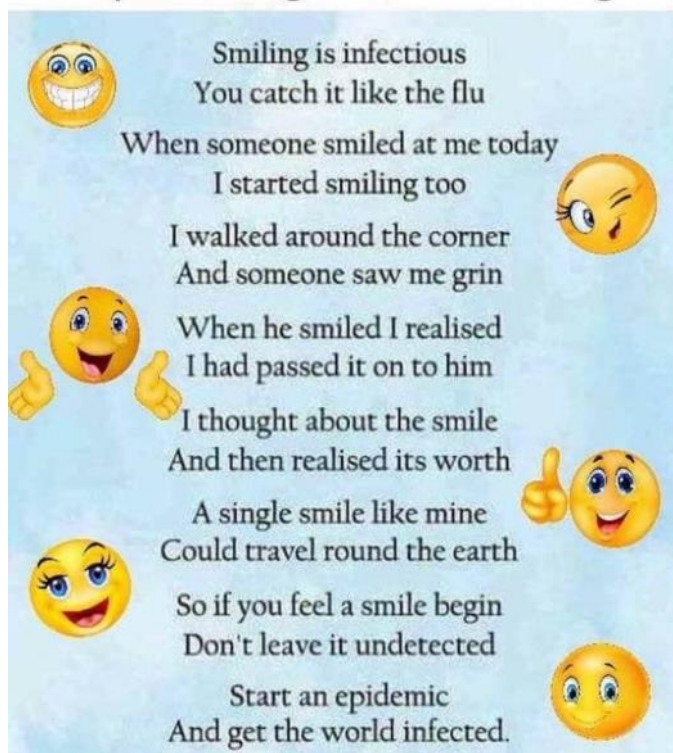

Hi everyone,

Sow Direct - Broad Beans, Coriander, Lettuce, Mustards, Pak choi, Parsley, Parsnip, Peas, Radish, Spinach, Turnip. Plant Seedlings - Broccoli, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Kale, Leek, Onions, Rocket, Silverbeet. Plant Bulbs/Cloves - Garlic. Plant Crowns/Runners/Suckers.



Companion planting - Many plants like to be planted with other plants that compliment or help them in some way. Some of the reasons to companion plant include: Attract beneficial bugs, both predator and pollinator, sacrificial plants - Distract bugs that would normally target a cropping plant, e.g. Calendula; Similar requirements - plants that like nitrogen with plants that generate nitrogen - Common examples include - Tomato and Basil - Corn, Beans and Squash, Climbing beans and runner beans dislike being planted near garlic or onions, Broad beans like being planted around peas and carrots. There are lots of combinations that do and don't work. If you're unsure, ask a gardener or check with the interweb.

Time to.....write a list of what you want to achieve in the garden this year....or at least this month. Think with the bigger picture in mind. Gardens take time and you want to visualise what you want to see in 12 months, 3 years, 5 years, 10 years. Sprinkle lime around lime loving plants like lilac, gypsophila, carnations and pinks. Plant summer bulbs such as gladiolus and hippeastrums. Lift Dahlia tubers, label with the colour and store in boxes of dry sand. Inspect lilly pillies for white wax scale, scrubbing off any infestations. Sort and clean old pots. Donate to a nursery or recycle. Rake fallen leaves into a pile and run the mower over them to create mulch, or add them to your compost bin. Harvest some of your Ginger rhizomes which are at least two years old. In Spring you can dig up the whole plant and split to have more in the future. Sharpen, clean and lubricate your tools.

Lawns - Carry out a Ph test. Apply liquid fertiliser, Iron and Manganese, Seaweed solution or similar. Hopefully you applied a pre-emergent last month so the weeds will be few or quiet. Spot spray weeds or remove by hand.

Remember it's Mothers' Day in May. Buy her a beautiful plant that will remind her of you and show you're thinking of her. A bunch of flowers is nice, but temporary. Buy something that can be planted or kept in a pot. If she is a crafty mum, buy a pretty pot, small potting mix and seasonal plant, then pot it together and create memories.

Please remember to look up tasks and ideas from previous May issues of the MRN. I am restricted with how much I can write and try to vary and include as much as I can without too much repetition from previous issues.

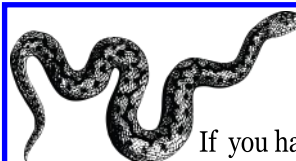

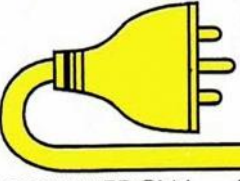

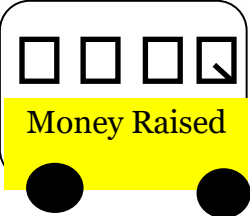
