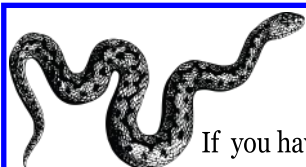
The Sovereign Hill Garden Club commences their 2025 year on Saturday 8th February at 1.30pm in Sovereign House.

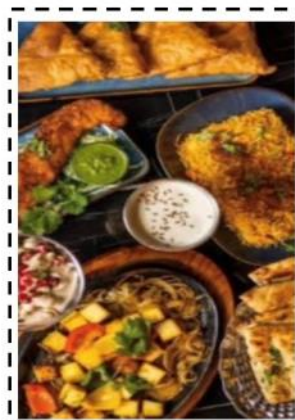
If you can donate or be involved in any way please contact Ian Hastings (mob: 0428 842 090) and he can direct you to the committee members responsible for the different parts of the stall.

Restaurant Review

Limestone Park Cafe



Delicious, nutritious and affordable. It's not often that a newly opened café may be summed up in just four words, but after the lunch that the fourteen of us from the Moore River News editorial committee enjoyed at the café operating out of the Limestone Park Stud, I am firmly of the opinion that those four words sum it up perfectly.

The food was attractively presented, loaded with flavour and perfectly cooked. I had a pulled pork slider (\$14.00) with two brioche buns, tender pulled pork coupled with plenty of crunchy salad while my partner enjoyed a BLT, (\$15.00) loaded with bacon and salad ,on a bed of rocket; in her opinion, the best BLT she's had for a very long time. Other dishes included salad bowls, toasted sour-dough with smoked salmon, and a very interesting looking platter for two.

The service was friendly and the staff obliging. There was some delay in getting our meals, the kitchen is quite small, and if I'd had my grandchildren with me, I think a plate of chips would have been a useful starter. Apparently they were perfectly cooked; golden and crunchy on the outside and soft on the inside. Another option could be to order and then visit the aviary with its plethora of birds, from finches to macaws.

Dessert consisted of gelato in a variety of flavours (the salted caramel is highly recommended) supplied from the nearby Local Goat. Just be a bit careful with that. One of our members went back three times! Tubs were \$6.00, while a cone was \$6.50. Go for the tub. It's served in a large blue coffee cup and makes for a wonderful sharing experience.

The café is located on Ferguson Road, just off Gingin Brook Road, 200 metres off the hard top. It's a large roofed area with no sides, so be a bit cautious about when you go. Our visit was conducted on a perfect day with a pleasant breeze, but a blustery southerly could mean warm clothing is needed.

This is a family run operation and is designed for families. I highly recommend a visit.

Purple Chair Opening on the Guilderton Foreshore

Prior to the next Neighbourhood Watch meeting at 6:00pm on Wednesday the 12th of February, the Lower Coastal Neighbourhood Watch group will be unveiling another Purple Bench on the Guilderton Foreshore. The Purple Bench Project aims to honor victims who have lost their lives to domestic and family violence. Along with serving as a lasting memory, purple benches added to parks and open spaces often feature a plaque that provides crisis contact numbers for those experiencing domestic and family violence. This initiative is supported by local government and members of parliament. The latest data from Australian Institute of Health and Welfare (AIHW) reports one woman a week is killed by a current or former partner; and one man a month is killed due to domestic and family violence. Purple is chosen as it is associated worldwide with the Domestic Violence awareness movement.

The first Neighbourhood Watch meeting for 2025 will be held after the above Purple Chair unveiling on Wednesday the 12th of February, commencing at 7pm at the Guilderton Community Hall. Supper is also provided for everyone after the meeting.

Why was my unlicensed motor cycle impounded and crushed?

If you ride your unregistered dirt bike on a road you run the risk of having it confiscated and crushed. Legislation now permits Police to seize any unregistered motorbike ridden on a road, regardless if you own the bike or not. The legislation also relates to any motorbike that is unregistered for 2 years or more and ridden on a road. Please use the appropriate off-road areas which we're fortunate to have close by in the Lancelin Sand Dunes.

Ambush. □

Time to get out into the garden early each day and enjoy some vitamin D and get some "you" time to just be. Relax in the garden paradise you're creating and just enjoy the moment. Mindfulness is easy to get in a garden as you absorb yourself in the beauty and serenity of a creation you and mother nature have worked hard to grow.

Heaps to do, as always, in your garden this month. I'll talk about the usual and then we'll look at ways to deter pests without the use of chemicals.

Vegetables to plant: Sow Seeds - Beans, Beetroot, Carrot, Fennel, Kohlrabi, Lettuce, Mustard greens, Parsley, Parsnip, Radish, Silverbeet, Swede, and Turnip. Plant Seedlings - Chives, and Zucchini. Sow seeds into trays - Broccoli, Brussel Sprouts, Cabbage, Cauliflower, Leek, and Onions

Lawns - Apply wetting agent (liquid or granular), Humic Acid, and late February and early March apply fertiliser.

Ways to deter pests

Edible Flowers - Encourage hoverflies, lacewings, and other predators to eat the mites, scale insects, and mealy bugs. Flowers like the French Marigold exude a chemical into the soil that deters root knot nematodes. Flowers also attract bees, both native and European, to assist in pollination.

Exclusion Netting - Cut garden hose, children's hula hoops, or I've even seen pool noodles, into half circles to hoop over your seedlings and vegetables. Stake them in with fencing wire, or even cutup wire coat hangers. Drape netting over the hoops and fasten with cable ties, kitchen wire ties, thin wire, or whatever helps to secure it to the hoops. I've seen people use lace curtains they picked up for cheap at the Op Shop as a cover for young seedlings. It shades the young seedlings, allows water and liquid nutrients through as well as protects them from flying, crawling, and slimy insects. If you are putting netting over fruit trees, wait for the fruit to set before netting so the bees will have done their pollination work before you shut them out. Netting purchased from the store often has holes big enough to let the bees in and out, however this also leaves enough room for pests to fly in and out.

Sounds and smells - Humming tape can scare birds when it emits a loud sound when it vibrates in the wind. Rabbits don't like the smell of dead animals so try spreading blood and bone around the problem rabbit areas. Careful if you have dogs though, they love blood and bone....rubbing in it, eating it, stuffing their noses into it.

Sacrificial crops - Aphids love Kale, cabbage, or flowering broccoli. Plant these around other crops you do want. The aphids and other pests may increase in numbers initially and this will invite beneficial predatory insects to feast on the aphids. On the subject of beneficial

predators, birds, frogs, and even bobtails (who love snails) should be encouraged in the garden. Bobtails can give a bit of a fright when you stumble across them, but they are very good at cleaning up a whole veg patch of snails very quickly.

Traps - Beer traps are very good for snails and slugs. Push a saucer with beer into the soil so the lip is flush with the ground level, cover it with an upside down wire hanging basket to deter the dog, and watch the snails creep in and drown when they smell the yeast. Please don't ask me for the beer though, I don't have any spare □. Pheromone traps are a good way to catch flying pests. They replicate the smell of the opposite sex, attracting only the male, or female of a species, and they then get stuck to the sticky surface of the trap. Traps can be pricey however. Traps can be very useful for figuring out how bad an infestation you have of a particular pest.

Pickup fallen fruit - Fruit fly (Medfly) cannot fly very far, only about 50m, and sometimes a little further if they can't find fruit to lay in. Picking up any fallen fruit helps to prevent the Fruit Fly from spreading. If you are getting fruit flies when you haven't had it before, chances are your neighbours may have it too.

Feeding and watering

Fertilise and water trees around their drip zone and keep mulch away from the base of the main trunk. Scrape mulch away from where you're feeding the plants and replace once fed. Heavy mulches like bark or wood chips also use nitrogen from the soil to break down so make sure to feed the plants they're protecting with a nitrogen rich fertiliser to replace what the mulch is taking from the soil. Feeding little, but often is a good strategy. Nitrogen for leaf growth and Potassium for fruiting plants and vegetables.

Feed your citrus trees around their drip zones with blood and bone, or complete citrus food. Feed them every two weeks and you will see results quickly. Check citrus for nutrient deficiencies like yellowing or pale leaves, browning leaf edges or yellowing veins.

If water is pooling on the surface of your sandy soil it is time to apply a wetting agent. Apply the agent and water in. Once the soil is moist apply a layer of compost and coarse mulch to prevent further drying out and improve conditions for root growth.

Before you feed plants, wet the soil well first, then fertilise, then water in again. Wetting first lets the plant know there are goodies on the way and to prepare, like the entrée/bread basket before a good meal.

Check your sprinkler heads regularly to ensure your plants are getting the water they need, nozzles aren't being blocked or knocked off by mowers or trimmers, and water is not being wasted in areas that don't need it.

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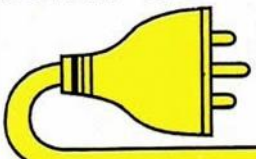
