Vegetarian Minestrone

Ingredients and instructions

1 lg Onion 2 Carrots 1 Zucchini 6 stalks celery (2 cups each) about 6 tomatoes

Fry these in two tablespoons of olive oil until cooked through, Add 1 teaspoon garlic.

1 Litre of Vegetable broth (this could be chicken if not wanting to be vegetarian)

2 cans (375g) of white or borlotti beans

1 Can Diced Tomato (375g)

Now add 1 cup spinach chopped

2 diced potatoes (1 cm)

1 cup tiny noodles (uncooked)

1 Tsp mixed herbs.

Add 2 tablespoons of olive oil to pot

Add 2 more cups of water and more fresh tomatoes if you have them. Bring to boil and allow to simmer for 20mins.

Served topped with grated Parmesan (you can add grated cheese if you want more protein)

This makes 8 serves.

Serve with crusty bread if desired

Their presence can stimulate the release of those feel-good hormones, like oxytocin, which helps reduce anxiety and lower the body's stress hormone, cortisol. For individuals coping with mental health challenges, these calming effects can help provide moments of peace and stability amidst life's struggles. As many of you may be aware, animals such as horses and dogs are increasingly being used in therapeutic settings. Animal-assisted therapy, utilises the natural bond between humans and animals to help individuals open up, build trust, and develop healthier coping strategies.

Owning animals also encourages us to get active and provide us with routine, both of which are vital for our mental health. Dog owners, for example, are more likely to engage in regular exercise, like walking, which helps to boost our mood and overall well-being. Similarly, caring for animals, whether it's feeding the cat or collecting the eggs, fosters a sense of responsibility and purpose that can be deeply rewarding.

Pets can also act as natural conversation starters, opening up opportunities for social interaction which can help to reduce feelings of loneliness. Have you ever struck up a conversation with a random stranger at the dog beach or park? These moments of connection can be surprisingly common! Until next month. Take care.

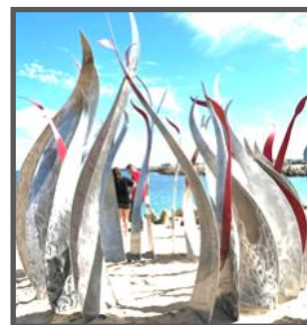


women who just meet for fun and friendship and boy oh boy have we had some laughs and made life long friendships!

The Huntsman and the Wolf

Terrifying or Terrific?

There are hundreds of species of Wolf spiders (Lycosidae) and Huntsman spiders (Sparassidae) in Australia, and they are two of our most feared spiders - inside or outside of the home. But they really don't deserve a bad reputation or our fear and loathing.

Huntsman spiders conjure up images of big hairy Tarantulas terrifying people when they scuttle out from behind curtains or crawl along the ceiling, and Wolf spiders seem to be everywhere – roaming in the garden or running along the floor, disappearing under the lounge.

The fact is these spiders, although sometimes frightening, are completely harmless, and if found in the house it is either by accident or they are only there to help you control insects like moths, crickets and flies, or even other spiders.

Huntsman spiders

These long-legged spiders, measuring up to 100mm or more across the legs, are grey to brown, sometimes with leg banding. They are nocturnal and are known for having keen eyesight making them excellent hunters – hence their name. Huntsman spiders are very sure footed and quick, often running down or leaping onto prey. They are known for their flattened bodies and laterigrade (forward pointing) legs and appear wider than long. They are found Australia wide, huddled in family groups, or solitarily in wood piles, under the bark of trees, on rock walls, under leaf litter and logs – and occasionally inside the house. Huntsman spiders have eight eyes in two rows of four – all the better to see you with!



Wolf spiders

These spiders measure between 10-80mm across, they are smaller and stouter than Huntsman spiders, with shorter legs. Unlike Huntsman spiders, their legs extend straight out from the body rather than being angled and positioned sideways. Their bodies appear longer than they are wide. They live on the ground and are usually dull brown with white, black or grey variegated markings or radiating bands. Wolf spiders are found Australia-wide in all habitats and are vagrant hunters making temporary retreats in vegetation, although some build burrows, either open or with a trapdoor. Wolf spiders have eight eyes in three rows of 4, 2, and 2. The 4 rear eyes are greatly enlarged and form a square making them very recognisable. They have excellent eyesight and chase down their prey, much like a wolf - and this is where they get their common name.



Remarkably, both these spiders also show some endearingly human traits. For example, Huntsman spider breeding pairs have lengthy courtships involving mutual caressing and dancing. Wolf spiders demonstrate incredible maternal care for their young. You may have seen the little spiderlings being carried on the mothers back whilst she teaches them how to hunt and protects them from danger, often for up to six months. Wolf spiderlings are aerial dispersal specialists, where they spin a silken thread to catch the wind and fly away in an act of dispersal called ballooning. Although they do spin silk, neither Huntsman nor Wolf spiders create a web for catching prey but will spin silk for their egg sacs.

We hope you've gained an appreciation for these remarkable creatures, understanding the differences between them and the differing roles they play in our ecosystem.

Nathan's Gardening Column

Welcome to the May edition of the garden column. This month we will look at coffee grinds and what they're good for, as well as the usual what to plant and other tasks you might complete.

Lawns - Use a high potassium (K) fertiliser to promote overall plant health. Set mower blades higher so more leaf; this helps with more root growth so it can cope better in the hot weather. Pre-emergent should already be in, however, if not, start looking for those weeds and pull them as soon as you spot them. Lawns love seaweed solutions just like the rest of your plants.

Vegies to plant: Artichoke crowns. Sow seeds - Broad beans, Lettuce, Mustards, Onions, Pak Choi, Radish, Spinach, and Turnip. Plant seedlings - Cauliflower, and Rocket. Plant garlic bulbs if you haven't already.

Coffee grinds - Tons of coffee grinds go to landfill every year. They can be very useful in many areas around the house. I recently found a good article in Pip Magazine with 7 suggestions for recycling your used grinds.

1 - Fertiliser. Sprinkle grinds around the base of your plants for them to break down and feed your plants slowly.

2 - Grinds are slightly acidic. Acid loving plants, like blueberries, will appreciate a natural acidic option to help them grow and flourish.

3 - Body scrub. Recipes can be found online for a coffee grind body scrub. What better way to attract your coffee loving love interest than to smell like their favourite beverage.

4 - Grow Mushrooms. You can make your own DIY mushroom growing kit. Commercial mushroom growers use coffee grinds to grow some delicious mushrooms so why not give it a go yourself.

5 - Natural dye. Silk and yarn can be coloured with a natural warm colour using old coffee grinds.

6 - Cooking. Coffee grinds can impart a subtle coffee kick to your recipes.

7 - Clean with it. Coffee grinds are abrasive and can be used in places you might otherwise use a steel scourer. Just be careful it doesn't stain what you're trying to clean.

For other ideas on permaculture and many other natural gardening ideas I really enjoy Pip Magazine. And, no, I don't get anything out of promoting their magazine, I just enjoy the content and more natural ways of dealing with many problems and how to grow healthy plants without the use of chemicals. Thank you also to Jo and Steve for suggesting I put in a note on used coffee grinds this month.

For the people who love to listen to garden ideas - Last month I listened to All the Dirt podcast about Small Eucalyptus varieties to plant in the garden, There are literally hundreds of smaller eucalypts you can grow in your garden and not have to worry about having to hire a tree lopper in 15 years because you didn't realise it would get that big.

Have a great May everyone, and remember, you're never too old to get down and dirty in the garden!

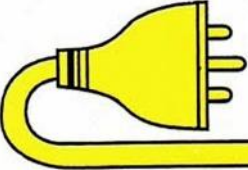

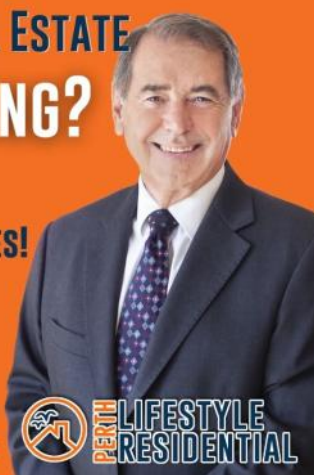
