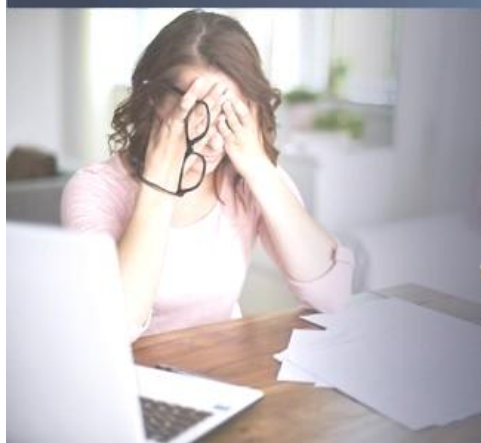

Planting Day at Guilderton dunes



Sunday July 13th was cool but dry for the wonderful volunteers who turned up to help plant about 650 native seedlings on our northern dunes.

The plants are mainly grown from provenance seed, collected from the dunes, and grown into plants by the very clever Apace nursery. They include native wisteria, oleara, scavola, Yanchep roses and various melaleucas and saltbush, all of which are ideally suited to the difficult coastal conditions. We protect them with covers for their first year in the elements.

Rachel and Helen at Moore Catchment Council have been getting grants to do this work for at least ten years, while GCA has coordinated with our members and locals to provide the volunteer workforce. We are outcompeting the weeds which are mainly pelargonium, sea spinach and onion weed. The invasive pyp grass is also being tackled thanks to MCC grants.

The results are really excellent and it is great to see the new growth each year and the large areas that have now been rehabilitated.

The workers really appreciated the fish and chip lunch at the Country Club following our morning's work.

Hello Readers,

E-Rideable Devices (ERDs): Community Awareness and Legal Requirements.

The use of E-Rideable Devices (ERDs) has become a topic of significant discussion in Western Australia. Recent tragedies involving ERDs have brought the issue into sharper focus, prompting increased attention from both the public and WA Police.

To help raise awareness, the below poster provides a clear and easy-to-understand summary of the current laws governing ERDs in Western Australia.

Police are empowered to issue infringements under the Road Traffic Code for a range of ERD-related offences. Additionally, officers have the authority to seize devices that:

- Exceed 25 km/h on level ground
- Do not meet the legal weight or size requirements

❑ Important: If an ERD is seized by Police, it will be confiscated and destroyed after 14 days.

To be legally classified as an ERD in Western Australia, a device must:

- Have at least one wheel
- Be designed for use by a single person
- Not exceed 25 km/h on level ground
- Weigh no more than 25 kg
- Be no larger than 125 cm (L) × 70 cm (W) × 135 cm (H)

While police prioritise community education, any breaches of the law or behaviour that poses a risk to public safety will be taken seriously. We encourage all residents to familiarise themselves with the rules and to speak with teenagers and others about the safe and lawful use of ERDs.

Protecting Our Coastline for Future Generations: Coastal Recreation Track Management Master Plan Adopted

The Shires of Coorow, Dandaragan and Gingin are pleased to announce the adoption of the *Coastal Recreation Track Management Master Plan (CRTMMP)* – a forward-thinking initiative designed to protect and enhance the unique landscapes of our northern coastal corridor, whilst continuing to provide locals and visitors with the recreational opportunities they love.

Stretching from the northern fringe of Perth to just north of Leeman, this iconic coastal stretch is renowned for its rugged beauty, sense of isolation and diverse range of nature-based activities – from four-wheel driving, to fishing, windsurfing and camping. Its popularity has grown steadily over the years, bringing both social and economic benefits to our coastal communities.

The CRTMMP aims to manage the balance between this growing demand and the need to protect our coastal environments and cultural values. The CRTMMP went out for public consultation in April, receiving mainly positive feedback including constructive input from four-wheel drive clubs and coastal groups. Thanks to funding from the State Natural Resource Management Program, co-contributions from the Shires and the invaluable efforts from land managers, community groups and volunteers, the CRTMMP was adopted by all three Shires at their respective June Council Meetings.

Key highlights of the CRTMMP include:

- Retaining popular recreation activities and sites, ensuring visitors can continue to enjoy the coast's natural attractions.
 - Clearly defining and sign-posting four-wheel drive travel routes to reduce track proliferation and protect sensitive landscapes.
 - Enhancing visitor orientation through improved signage and educational material, making it easier and safer for people to explore.
 - Protecting conservation and cultural values by excluding vehicles from specific sensitive areas.
 - Assessing and upgrading existing recreation sites to enhance visitor experiences, while closing and rehabilitating sites at risk of environmental damage.
- Importantly, the CRTMMP complements and aligns with other coastal and land management plans, including the DBCA Nilgen Wanagarren Master Plan and regional coastal strategies, establishing a coordinated approach across the three Shires.

By carefully managing where and how recreation occurs, the Shires of Coorow, Dandaragan and Gingin are taking proactive steps to safeguard the environmental and cultural values that make this coastline so special, ensuring they can be enjoyed by generations to come.

Demolition of Hinchcliffe Street Lookout and Removal of Memorial Plaques

Due to the ongoing and severe coastal erosion affecting the coastal dunes in Lancelin, the Shire of Gingin has made the difficult decision to remove the Hinchcliffe Lookout.

The demolition commenced on Friday 18 July 2025 and included the entire Hinchcliffe Lookout platform and the stairs down to the Lancelin Sands Hotel.

The Shire has attempted to contact the original applicants for each memorial plaque - using the contact details provided at the time of application - to inform them of the removal and to offer the opportunity to reclaim their plaque. If you have previously arranged for a plaque at the Hinchcliffe Lookout and would like to have it returned, please email us at mail@gingin.wa.gov.au.

Any plaques not reclaimed will be stored by the Shire. The Shire will explore the possibility of a new location for the plaques to be displayed.

GARDEN

COLUMN



Veggies to plant/sow - Asparagus (crowns). Basil, Broccoli, Capsicums, Chilli, Leek, Melons, Silverbeet, Tomatoes, and Zucchini can all be sown undercover. Beetroot, Carrot, Kohlrabi, Lettuce, Mustards, Peas, Radish, Spring Onions.

Spring Onions can be sown directly in the beds they will be harvested from. Onion seedlings can go into the ground now. Potatoes can go in too. Sow Rocket into seed trays.

Lawns

- Apply pest control. Many pest control chemicals have a lasting effect and can prevent pests for up to 6 months. Instead of dealing with them when they have already damaged the lawn, apply pest preventative now to keep your lawn green throughout the season.
- Lawns lacking colour, turning yellow, can have an application of iron and manganese. If you want an instant hit of green apply Colour Guard or other lawn dye that also has iron in it for a longer lasting green.
- Remove any weeds before they set seed. Weed seeds can sit in the ground for years before germinating. Using sharp blades, a catcher on your mower, and cleaning your mower afterwards helps to reduce weeds from spreading.

Other Tasks:

- Plant Spring flowering plants
- Prepare vegetable gardens now for spring planting
- Prune roses, evergreen and deciduous trees if you haven't already
- Lawn Installation
- Mass plantings of colour
- Plant natives. Revegetation tube stock is a cheap way to plant a lot for very little money
- Fertilising. Organic fertilisers take weeks or months to break down enough to be useful to the plant.
- Visit other local gardens and attend garden shows for inspiration and motivation. Many flower festivals and shows are in August and September each year.
- Pest Control
- Test reticulation systems. Replace broken or leaking sprinkler heads, solenoids and pipes 🌻

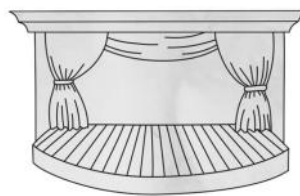
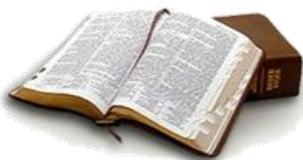

European wasp successful season

The European wasp 2024-25 season has drawn to a close with 31 nests found and destroyed!

Western Australians can now relax and enjoy the coming few months knowing that the



European wasps feed on grapes and other fruit, human and pet food, insects and dead animals like rats, kangaroos and bandicoots.

aggressive and invasive pest has once again been thwarted in its efforts to establish itself in WA. Every year fertilised queens enter WA via vehicles, freight and cargo from interstate where they are well established and a major social, environmental and economic pest.

WA has been entrenched in a battle for the past 48 years to prevent this pest from calling our state home. Since the first detection in 1977 WA has undergone a surveillance and eradication program, developing early detection techniques and trapping systems to locate and destroy any nests that spawn in WA. A large part of this success is due to public awareness and reporting of wasp sightings. Three of the nests destroyed this season were due directly to public reports.

The majority of nests were detected and destroyed in the City of Belmont and City of Canning in industrial areas that take delivery of interstate freight, as well as around the interstate rail freight yards. There were two regional nests destroyed: one in the suburb of Webberton in Geraldton and one in the town of Napier just north of Albany. Around 3000 surveillance traps were deployed in the Perth metropolitan area and in strategic higher risk regional centres.

What to look for

There are similar looking black and yellow wasps in WA, so look for these key characteristics:

- **Scavenging** on human food and drinks, fruit like grapes, apples and stone fruit, pet food and roadkill (carrion).
- **Nest underground** - nests are HUGE, growing larger than a basketball in a single season, and have a small (golf ball sized) entrance hole.
- Completely **black** antenna.
- **Legs up** in flight (rear legs don't dangle).
