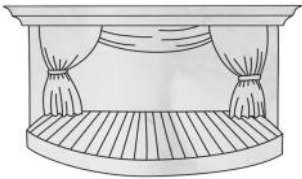

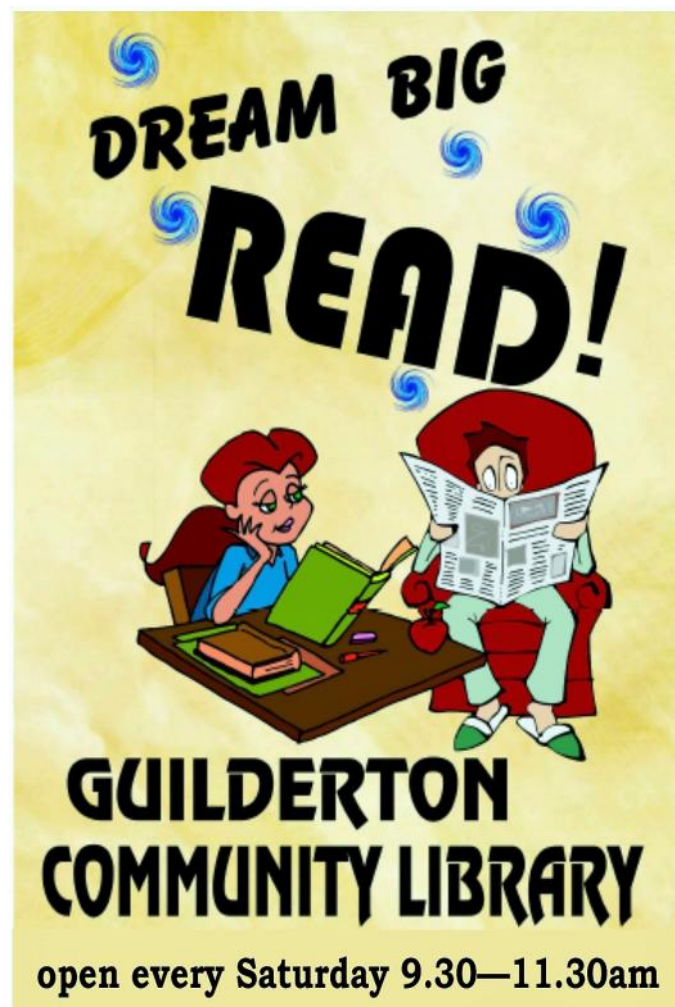

The passes are designed to last for years to come, so please keep yours safe – if lost, we can supply you with a new one for a replacement fee. Please note, the Waste Facility Passes will automatically reset every year, so you don't need to do anything. This year, your pass will reset on **1 September**.

Tip Pass FAQs:

- Lost your pass? You can order a replacement by contacting the Shire.
- If your property has been classified as 'Commercial', but you believe your property should receive a 'Residential' visit allowance, please contact the Shire.
- Keep your pass – it will automatically update on 1 September once Council has endorsed the new Fees and Charges.
- Any unused visits from the current year won't carry over to the next year once the new allocation starts.
- Keep your pass safe and use it responsibly.

Hello to all you amazing garden lovers.

Spring has sprung and we have a lot to keep us busy. With so much beautiful rain these last few months, the weeds are growing madly, and the deep watering has encouraged the trees and shrubs to send their roots down chasing water and nutrients. I think we're in for a bumper season 😊



Herbs / Veges to plant this month: Sow Direct - Basil, Beans (bush and runners), Beetroot, Carrot, Chives, Corn, Cucumber, Dill, Daikon, Fennel, Kohlrabi, Lettuce, Mustards, Parsley, Potatoes, Radish, Rockets, Spring Onions, Turnip, and Zucchini. Seedlings - Coriander, Silverbeet. Sow in trays - Broccoli, Cabbage, Eggplant, Leek, Luffa, Marrow and Celery. Plant undercover in trays - Capsicum, Chilli, Eggplant, Leek, Melons, Pumpkin, and Tomatoes.

Other jobs to get completed in September -

- **Prune Winter flowering plants** to encourage new foliage during Spring.

- **Test your irrigation system.** Test each station, unblock nozzles, repair damaged pipes and replace parts as needed.

- **Apply Liquid fertiliser** and slow-release fertilisers onto garden beds. Added trace elements will encourage stronger roots, colour, flowering, and growth

- **Spray for pests.** They love they new foliage that is appearing and will target the soft juicy parts of the plants first

Shape deciduous trees to improve their structure and to stimulate new growth

Lawns -

- With the weather starting to warm up your **lawns will be ready for a feed.** Apply fertiliser to feed the lawn and get it off to a good start. I apply a granular NPK ratio of 25-0-13 +3%Fe to get the lawn flying and get any colour back it may have lost over Winter.

- **Apply a pre-emergent** to prevent weeds from appearing. Check the label for the dosage amount per square meter. Too little and the weeds will still appear. If you didn't apply a Winter pre-emergent, you'll need to hand pull the weeds or spray them with a selective herbicide. Personally, I got to lawn chemical specialist suppliers for my chemicals. Their knowledge is invaluable, and they tend to have some less harmful options available to deal with the weeds

Fruit Trees Fertilising List for Spring -

- Almond, Cherry, Plums, Apples, Pears, Avocado, Banana, Blackberries, Raspberries, All your citrus trees, Custard Apples, Figs, Gooseberries, Grape, Kiwifruit, Loquat, Lychee Mango, Mulberry, Olive, Papaya, Passionfruit, Pecan Pomegranate, Walnut.

Everything else can wait and you'll have to contact me directly if you want to know what to feed them all. I'm limited to one column in the MRN, sorry.

Hi from all the Crafty Patch members. We are a lovely group of ladies who meet every Tuesday morning at 9am at the Woodridge Hall.

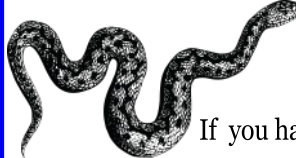

Biosecurity Blitz 2025: Scanning for Land and Water Invaders

Vigilance is key

Spotting invasive species early helps prevent pest outbreaks and protects our local environment. When community members report what they see, we can identify these species quickly and act before they spread. Your observations make a real difference in managing these threats.

Power in numbers

Keen-eyed observers across Western Australia can sign up to take part in DPIRD's [Biosecurity Blitz 2025](#) (16 October to 16 November) to report not just pests, but also unsung beneficial organisms that play a vital role in maintaining ecological balance, pollination, and naturally help control pest populations.

Past Biosecurity Blitz observations revealed increased sightings of beneficial bugs like hover flies and lacewings in urban gardens, clear signs that habitat-friendly practices are taking root across local communities. Predators, such as lacewings, ladybirds, and predatory mites, actively hunt and consume pests. Parasitic wasps, hover flies, and even some spiders, lay their eggs on or inside pest species. Their larvae then feed on the host, often killing it in the process.

Community observations help shape the story of WA's biodiversity. What new discoveries will this year's Biosecurity Blitz uncover? DPIRD encourages people of all ages to sign up, download the [MyPestGuide® Reporter](#) app, submit sightings, and share photos to help map beneficial species and confirm the absence of exotic pests across WA.

Don't forget the waterways

Biosecurity Blitz 2025 isn't just about gardens and bushland—it's also about what's lurking in our waterways. Invasive aquatic species like carp and the carpet sea squirt (*Didemnum vexillum*)

threaten WA's biodiversity and can spread through floods, fishing, boating, and pet release. Other pests like non-native crustaceans, molluscs, and worms, can disrupt ecosystems and impact industries like aquaculture and tourism.

Even hardy aquarium fish can become invasive if released. Pearl cichlids, for example, are not native to Australia and compete aggressively with local species. Originally 5–15 cm as pets, they've grown to over 30 cm in Perth waterways!

While taking part in the Blitz, report any sightings of released aquarium fish using the MyPestGuide® Reporter app. Your actions help protect WA's aquatic ecosystems. Happy hunting!

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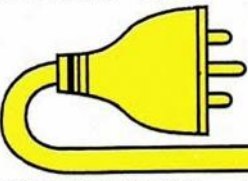
