COPS**CORNER****Burglary Charges for Wanneroo Man**

A 43-year-old Wanneroo man has been charged following an investigation into a burglary that occurred in Woodridge on 25 April 2026. It will be alleged that during the incident, the man cut the locks from a shipping container and stole four off-road motorbikes with a combined value of \$12,000. The following day, Lancelin Police executed a search warrant at a Wanneroo address, where all four motorbikes were successfully recovered for a very relieved owner.

On the 7th of May, Lancelin Police located, arrested & charged the accused with the following offences:

- 1 x Burglary and Commit
- 4 x Steal Motor Vehicle to Use Without the Consent of the Owner

The man is next due to appear before the Joondalup Magistrates Court in early June.

Guilty Plea for Nilgen Man Charged with Burglary

Late last year, Lancelin Police reported that a 44-year-old Nilgen man had been charged with Burglary, Stealing and Fraud following an investigation into offences committed in Nilgen between March and May 2025. As a result of further investigations, the same man was subsequently charged in connection with a burglary at the Lancelin Golf Club in September 2025. The man has since pleaded guilty to several offences and is currently remanded in custody awaiting sentencing in early June.

Court Fine Issued for Inadequate Firearm Storage

A 37-year-old man has been fined \$800 in court for failing to adequately secure firearms on a farming property in Cowalla. This serves as a timely reminder to all licensed firearm holders to ensure firearms are stored securely and in accordance with legislative requirements at all times when not in use.

Car Seized Following Traffic Offences in Lancelin

A 24-year-old Ballajura man has been charged with Drink Driving and No Authority to Drive following a day trip to the Lancelin Sand Dunes with a group of friends from Perth. Police stopped the vehicle in Lancelin after receiving reports of reckless driving behaviour. The hire vehicle being driven by the man

was subsequently seized. The man is due to appear before the Joondalup court next month.

Report

The Stable Fly Action Group Inc (SFAG) has been active for over 20 years with the aim to reduce the impact of stable flies where rural communities and horticulture coexist.

SFAG's primary objective is to pro-actively advocate for strategies to minimise the stable fly problem in WA through lobbying, publicity, education and collaboration.

SFAG's current focus is:

- Supporting LGA officers to investigate and mitigate stable fly outbreaks
- Supporting affected community members and reporting outbreak data to DPIRD
- Supporting further scientific research and trials to reduce stable fly outbreaks
- Lobbying government for meaningful reforms to current legislation (BAM Act)
- Lobbying for enforceable changes to reticulated horticulture management practices to reduce stable fly breeding sites
- Lobbying for a simple waybill system for all raw manure shipments
- Highlighting current biosecurity risks and helping avert potential future diseases

SFAG is a volunteer organisation that relies heavily on community support and membership.

Here's a very easy banana oat biscuit recipe using what you already have.

2-Ingredient Banana Oat Biscuits

Ingredients

- 4 ripe bananas
- 2 to 2½ cups rolled oats

Optional add-ins

- Cinnamon
- Chocolate chips
- Raisins
- Peanut butter
- Vanilla
- Chopped nuts

Method

- 1 Preheat oven to **180°C (350°F)**.
- 2 Mash the bananas in a bowl until mostly smooth.
- 3 Stir in the oats until you get a thick, scoopable mixture.
 - Start with 2 cups oats and add more if the mix feels too wet.
- 4 Add any extras you like.
- 5 Scoop spoonfuls onto a lined baking tray and flatten slightly.
- 6 Bake for **12–15 minutes** until lightly golden. These are soft, chewy breakfast-style biscuits rather than crunchy cookie

A history was given on how the garden evolved over time to what is there now. The main aim of this garden is to be water wise and not to have to water it every day. Plants that successfully grow have been propagated and encouraged to spread. Excess seeds and seedlings were shared with the members.

We also visited another local garden which has been established 3 years ago with mainly natives and a veggie patch – it was amazing that it had only been established in such a short period of time.

The garden club members shared what they have been doing in their garden in the last month – mainly weeding, pruning and getting ready for winter, various options to get rid of mice.

We also discussed dehydration of fruit and vegetables and options available – electrical vs building a solar dehydrating box.

Nathan shared his “tool of the month” – a rechargeable battery operated secateurs – easy to operate with long lasting battery. It can comfortably cut branches up to 25mm. An excellent tool to use to prune shrubs, roses etc without overworking your hands.

It was a very enjoyable afternoon discussing a variety of interesting topics and a beautiful afternoon tea provided by the members.

The next meeting will be held in Woodridge on 13 June 2026 where we will be doing a Bonsai workshop.

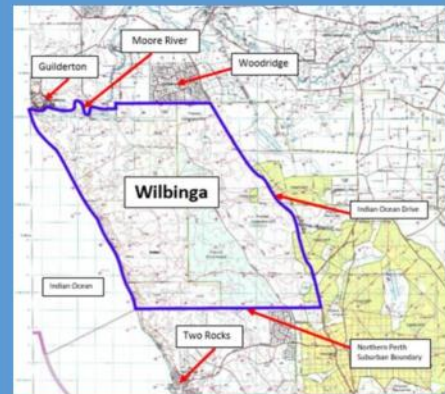
The campaign to create a Wilbinga National Park is essentially born out of the following facts –

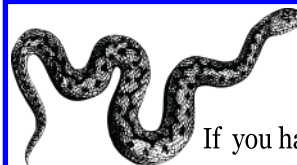
