SFAG's primary objective is to pro-actively advocate for strategies to minimise the stable fly problem in WA through lobbying, publicity, education and collaboration.

SFAG's current focus is:

- Supporting LGA officers to investigate and mitigate stable fly outbreaks
- Supporting affected community members and reporting outbreak data to DPIRD
- Supporting further scientific research and trials to reduce stable fly outbreaks
- Lobbying government for meaningful reforms to current legislation (BAM Act)
- Lobbying for enforceable changes to reticulated horticulture management practices to reduce stable fly breeding sites
- Lobbying for a simple waybill system for all raw manure shipments
- Highlighting current biosecurity risks and helping avert potential future diseases

We have some very interesting information in the Visitor Centre. Some of it on the maritime history of the area.

Did you know that the first recorded sinking of a vessel off our coast was the "Verguide Draeck" in 1656? Guilderton was actually named after 40 Dutch coins which were found in the dunes.

Vessels sunk between Guilderton and Lancelin were:

1656 - a Dutch merchant sailing ship - "Verguide Draeck"
1868 - 40 tonne schooner rigged coastal trading vessel. - "Emily"

1874 - 40 tonne two masted schooner - "Seabird"
1897 - 880 tonne three masted steel barque - "Villalta"
1901 - French four masted iron barque - "Ville de Rouen"
1910 - Pearl lugger - "Hugh Norman"
1914 - 260 ton wooden topsail schooner - "Grace Darling"
1915 - Steam powered hopper barge - "J P Webb"
1923 - 53 tonne wooden schooner - "Seaflower"
1923 - 63 tonne wooden steam sailer - "SS Venus"
1946 - coastal steamer - "Manakoora"
1950 - 72 foot ex naval vessel - "Linda".

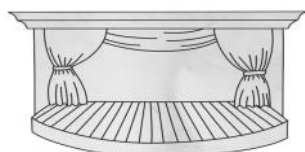

COPS**CORNER**Hello Readers.**Stolen Motorbike Recovered in Lancelin**

What started as a frustrating theft ended with a quick recovery and one very happy owner. In broad daylight on Tuesday, 16 June 2026, a Honda CRF110F motorbike was stolen from the back of a Ute near Lancelin Mechanical. Thanks to some good old-fashioned police work and determined follow-up inquiries, Lancelin Police quickly identified and tracked down the suspect, recovering the stolen bike and reuniting it with its grateful owner before lunch the following day — less than 24 hours after it was taken. A great result for the community and another reminder that stolen property can often be recovered when reported promptly.

Spike in Impersonating Police Officer Scams

Western Australia is currently experiencing a spike in scams involving offenders impersonating WA Police officers. Reports include callers using phone numbers linked to legitimate police stations, attempting to obtain personal, financial and cryptocurrency details.

WA Police will not:

- Ask for personal financial details
- Demand payment
- Direct people to transfer cryptocurrency or other assets
- Request remote access to devices
- Threaten a person with arrest

Scammers can alter phone numbers to appear as legitimate WA Police Stations to increase their credibility.

Protect yourself:

- Don't Trust, Verify
- Hang up and contact organisations using official website numbers
- Never share personal or financial information

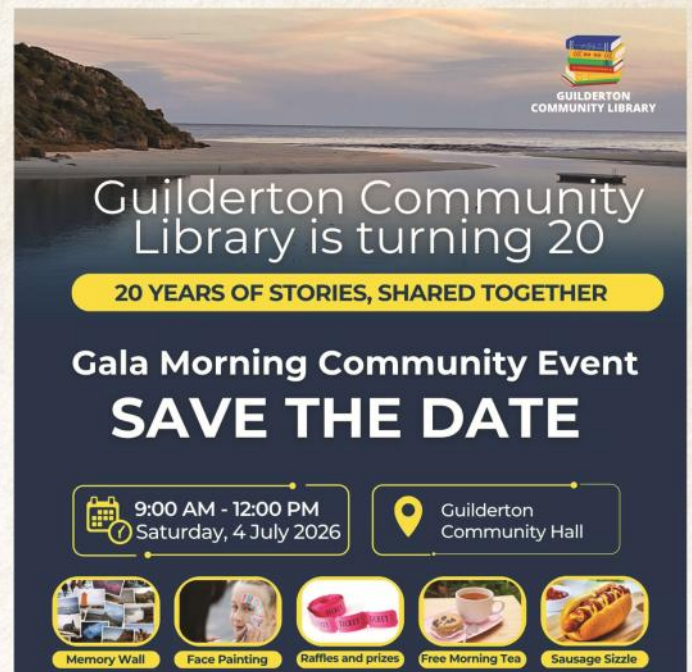

Pyp grass (*Ehrharta villosa*) is an aggressive perennial, rhizomatous grass native to South Africa that acts as a major environmental weed, particularly on Australian coastal dunes including Guilderton. It was introduced for sand stabilisation but spreads rapidly through underground stems and seeds, forming dense stands that outcompete native vegetation and degrade coastal biodiversity.

Its like couch on steroids !

We've been coordinating projects to eradicate it in from the Guilderton dunes since 2015. Its slow costly work - and frankly really boring to deal with but we are getting there !

The photo at the top was from 2015 (pure Pyp and weedy Pelargonium) - now 1000% better.

Even at the estuary lookout after 2 years, looks way better.

We've been getting the community to plant natives to smother the dying/dead Pyp - the Acacias, Olearia, Calothamnus are particularly good at smothering !!

Slowly slowly we're making headway.

Huge thanks to the [State Natural Resource Management Program WA](#) and [Shire of Gingin](#) for providing funds to continue spraying over the past 12-18 months.

People think its a waste of time/money but I was at Ledge Point not long ago where active Pyp Grass spraying ceased and now it re-smothered most of the dunes there.

Mid Winter is a busy month in the garden. Time to prune, clean, and prepare gardens for their Spring and Summer growth.

Veges to sow: artichoke, asparagus crowns, broad bean, beetroot, broccoli,

cabbage, cauliflower, capsicum, cress, garlic, lettuce, onions, leek, potatoes, radish, salsify, spinach, peas, silver beet, and early tomatoes.

Flowers to sow: candytuft, larkspur, alyssum, cineraria, forget-me-not, lupin, poppies, stock

Things to get done in the garden this month

- o Flowering roses (Hybrid Teas, Floribundas, Miniature, David Austin - prune mid-July to early August.
- o Spring flowering climbers (Banksia roses, and climbing heritage varieties) Prune immediately after they have finished flowering in late spring/early summer
- o Standard roses (roses grafted onto a single stem) Prune late July to early August
- o Deadhead and cut away dead or diseased canes to keep the bust tidy and to discourage pests
- o Tomatoes - I know it seems early, but Winter is a good time to start planning and preparing for your tomatoes. In winter I look at what varieties I want to grow and order seeds. I prefer buying online because there are more varieties available than there are in the stores. This year I am planting cordon varieties for salads and cooking. Cordon varieties grow like a vine and take a little more work than bush varieties. picking. Tomatoes love full sun but will like a bit of shade during the hottest days.
- o Keep the regular feeding of vegetables up. I fertilise fortnightly, although I am a bit hands off and let them do

what they want, just feeding them every couple of weeks. Fruiting veges like extra potassium to encourage blooms and fruiting, but wait for those first buds to appear. Read the instruction as over doing potassium can result in calcium uptake issues

o Lawns - deal with those weeds. Hand pulling, roots and all is best, but spray is you must or if there is just too many. It will soon be time to apply pre-emergent to prevent summer weeds.

o Spray insecticidal soap and oil on those citrus trees plagued by bugs (black mould on the leaves is one sign as well as curled up edges. Leaves turning yellow is more an indication of nutrient deficiency, so in the alternate weeks of spraying for insects, spray trace elements. **I say spray because more nutrients are taken in faster by the leaves than is by the roots.** Feel free to water in nutrients - whatever works and is easier for you 😊

o Maintain those garden tools - get the grinder, file, dremel, whatever works for you out and sharpen them. Oil any moving parts, and replace air filter, oil, and spark plugs as a minimum for engine powered tools. And remember - feed the soil, not the plant. Using organic will benefit the plants over a longer period. Dig in composted manure, it's not like we are short of it around here. Yes, you may get a few more weeds, but it will pay off in the long run. Plus, most of the weeds we get around here are actually edible, or can be turned into fertiliser for future plants. I grow Borage and Comfrey for just that purpose, and purslane tastes great on a salad. It is full of Omega 3, Vitamins A, C and E, potassium, and antioxidants.

Anyway, I had better sign off. I get in trouble for writing too much. Happy gardening in July everyone 😊🌱

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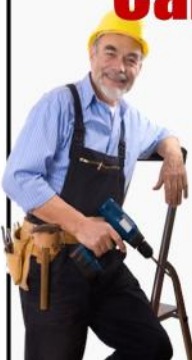
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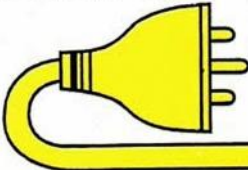
